In the Name of God Amen, the ninth Day of April 1734, I Samuell Mayo of the Town of Harwich in the County of Barnstable in the province of the Massachusetts Bay in New England being under the Infirmity of old age but of perfect mind and memory therefore calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to Dye, do make and ordain this this (sic) my Last Will and Testament that is to say, principally and first of all I Give and Recomend my Soul into the hand of God that Gave it and my body I recomend to the Earth to be buried in Decent Christian burial at the Discretion of my Executor nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as Touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this Life I Give and Dispose of the same in the following manner and form.

Imprimis: I Give and bequeath to my son Samuell Mayo all that my parcell of Lands Lying and being in the Township of Harwich comonly called and known by the name of Chaqueset and to his Heirs and Assigns forever,

Item. I give to my son Jonathan Mayo my Dwelling house and house Lot and barn and all my right in the Land comonly called the great field and the Dry Swamp and all my Lands adjoining thereto and one Lot of woodland in Harwich Lying by the pond by William Bakers and to his heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I Give to my sons Samuel Mayo and Jonathan Mayo a parcell of woodland lying in Harwich in the seventeen shares purchase Lying near Thomas Freemans Cartway, Equally to them and their Heirs forever. I also give to my said sons Samuel Mayo and Jonathan Mayo all my medow Lands lying in the town of Eastham Equally to them and their Heirs and assigns forever, and also a parcel of Land Joyning to ye meddow at Rock Harbour.

Item. I Give to my Daughter Mercy Cole all that parcell of Land Lying near the house where she now Lives as the fence now stands and to her Heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I give to Rebecca Cole wife to Stephen Cole all my part of a Lot of woodland in the seventeen shares purchase Lying by ye Easterly side of John Sparrows Lot and all that my part and parcell of Land lying near Stephen Coles Land and to her heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I Give to my Grandson Thomas Mayo one Lot of Land at Sipsons Island and it is the fifth Lot in our Division and to his Heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I give to my Daughter Rebecca Cole and my Daughter Mercy Cole wife to John Cole and to my Daughter Mary Smith ye wife of Ralph Smith and to the Heirs of my Daughter Hannah Hopkins Deceased, and to the Heirs of my Daughter Sarah Higgins wife to James Higgins Now Deceased and to ye Heirs and assigns

forever two Lots of Land lying in the seventeen shares purchase in Equal shares that is to say I Give to the Heirs of Each of my Deceased Daughters, so much as I Give to one of my Daughters that are surviving and to their Heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I Give to my son Samuell Mayo my Great bible my Gun and my cain. I give to my son Jonathan Mayo my cart and wheels.

Item. I Give to my two sons Sam^l Mayo and Jonathan Mayo all my wearing Apparell and all my tools and Impliments for Husbandry in Equal proportion to be Divided between my said two sons and after all my Just Debts and my funeral Charges are paid my will is y^t the Remainder of my money and moveables to Equally Divided between my Daughters namely my Daughter Rebecca Cole wife to Stephen Cole and my Daughter Mary Smith wife to Ralph Smith and the Heirs of my Daughter Hannah Hopkins Deceased and the Heirs of my Daughter Sarah Higgins Deceased that is to say as much to ye Heirs of one of my Deceased Daughters as to one of my Daughters y^t are Surviving and Likewise I constitute make and ordain my well beloved son Samuell Mayo my sole Executor of this my Last Will and Testament. And I do hereby utterly Disallow revoke and Disannull all other former wills and Testaments by me made Ratifying and confirming this and no others to be my Last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the Day and Year within and above written.

I hereby certify that on pages 508, 509 & 510, of Book No. 5. of the Probate Records of this office, is the record of the will of Sion Seabury, mentioning his daughter Dorcas wife of Abner Sowle. Said will was probated Aug. 15th 1801.

I hereby certify that in the volume in this office, containing the records of the probate court, from May 3rd 1819 to November 6th 1826, it is recorded that William Cory, "Administrator of Abner Sowle, presented his acct. of administration which acct. was allowed and ordered recorded."

N.B. The above quotation is from the record of a session of the probate court held on Apr. 3rd 1820.
