 master Joseph Rowlandson and Ralph Houghson our goodes of this
 my Last will as aforesaid, to see this my said will truly and faithfully
 performed, according to the true intent thereof, first as touching these
 outward blessing the Lord in mostio hart, be trusted me with, it is my
 earnest desire that the family and estate may be kept to gether so long
 as it may be thought convenient to the exutors and our goodes aforesaid
 or the maior part of them, and for to be disposed of according to their di-
 cretion as aforesaid, to gether with they directions after mentioned: first with
 respect to be had to my wifes comfortable living during her naturall life
 & that my sonn Thomas Willdeor to have a double portion, and liberty
 to keep and improve his owne estat either in realty, or other estate, whiche
 he now stand possesed of, and the best of my children namly John nalsau-
 all Elizabeth, and Elizabeth to receive portions of such kin as my aforesaid
 exutors and our goodes shall see they have need of it, and are payabls of
 making improvement of it, whosoever it be in Lands or other estate, and as for
 my daughter mariu, for as much as shee hath already received a competent
 portion and is already provided for, yet notwithstanding it is my desire
 shee should have sum what, according to the discretion of my exutors or
 our goodes aforesaid, with respect to be had to the blessing of god upon the
 estate, in reference to all my childrens portions aforesaid, and if any
 of the aforesaid my our goodes shall by the providence of god be taken
 away by death, or otherwise that then forth with the other two to gether
 with my exutors, shall choose an other in his place, and for satisfaction
 that the number aforesaid may be continued to manage the be trust
