State of Vermont On this twentieth day
of Essex County ss I of February in the year

of our Lord one thousand
Eight hundred and nineteen, before me
the subscriber one of the Judges of the County
Court within and for the County of Essex &
State of Vermont, Personally appears Sam-
uel Gates, ^{resident} in said County of
Essex aged fifty eight years, who being by me
first duly sworn according to Law, doth verily
swear make the following declaration in order
to obtain the provisions made by the late act
of Congress entitled an act to provide for
certain persons engaged in the land and naval
service of the United States in the Revolutionary

War. That he the said Samuel Gates was
listed in the town of Marlborough in the State
of Massachusetts on the 17th day of March A.D.
1777 in the Company commanded by Capt Daniel
Barns in the 15th Massachusetts Regiment
Col. Timothy Bigelow of the Massachusetts Line
for the three years service. That he continued
to serve in said Corps, or in the service of the
United ^{States} for and during the whole of the aforesaid
term of three years when he was honorably
discharged from service in the State of New-
York at a place called the Highlands —
That he was in the battles at Bemis Heights
& Monmouth. And that he is absolutely in
reduced circumstances and stands in need of
— the —

the assistance of his country for supports
and that he has no other residence now
in his power of his said services —
Sworn to and declared before me the day
and year aforesaid

within and for the County of Essex and
State of Vermont, as aforesaid do testify
that it appears to my satisfaction that the
said Samuel Gates did serve in the revolu-
tionary War, as stated in the preceding
declaration against the common enemy
for the full term of nine months and more
at one period of his lifetime.

And also testify that I am personally acquaint-
ed with the said Samuel Gates and know that
he is absolutely in reduced circumstances and
stands in need of the assistance of his country
for supports, and also that the Court over which
I preside is a Court of Records. And I now
transmit the proceedings and testimony taken
and have before me to the Secretary for
the Department of War pursuant to the
aforesaid act of Congress —

In Feb 1819 ~~he~~ applied for pension aged 58 years he was living in Lunenburg
Alfred to vt made an affidavit before Mr Gates JP in July 1832 & certified to
by Mr Gates clerk of Sup^r Court apparently same person

He enlisted at Dorchester Mass in Jan 1776 for 12 months with Capt David Barnes
in regt of Colo Josi Ward - no detentions - After his discharge he enlisted
at Marlboro Mass with Capt David Barnes in 15th Mass regt Colo Tim Bigelow
for 3 years In the Battles at Bunker Heights (Sept 19 & Oct 4, 1777 which was followed
by Surrender of Burgoyne Oct 19, 1777) & at Monmouth N. J. (Jan 28, 1778) (War
at Valley Forge
(at Fort Mifflin)

There was in the Regt a Capt ~~Mr~~ Gates who left in July 1778 & 4
others of the family name - ^{in Capt Barnes Company} one of whom died in Jan 1778 & another in July
1778 -
