What Happens When You Think You Know...

Sometimes it isn't what we don't know when searching for our ancestors, it's what we think we know that's the problem. I was researching my great grandparents, Christie and Josie Adney. The first thing that you're probably thinking is that I should have been looking for Christopher and Josephine. I had only been working on my genealogy about a year but I did know that much. I found Christopher in the 1930 census in Nebraska and both Christopher and Josephine on the 1910 and 1920 census in Nebraska. The census indicated Christie was born in 1866, Josie in 1871, and both in Wisconsin. This took my search back to Wisconsin. Christopher (born in 1866) was on the 1870 and 1880 census

This took my search back to Wisconsin. Christopher (born in 1866) was on the 1870 and 1880 census with his birth family. I didn't know Josie's maiden name but I found them listed together with my grandmother and her brother on the 1900 census.

I found the gravesite of Christopher, but I couldn't find Josie after 1920. At this point, I assumed she had died sometime between 1920 and 1930, but I kept getting hits on a Josephine Adney's death in California in 1941. Here's the problem, I "know" this couldn't have been my Josie--what would she be doing here in California all by herself and after her presumed death date? Further, I'm sure none of my family on any side was in California until after my dad and three uncles returned from the Pacific after World War II.

After much more searching and with no other leads on Josie, I finally decided to check into this "wrong" Josephine. (After all, eliminating what you know to be false is actually helpful!) So I'm off to my first inperson quest for a vital record; luckily it's a short drive to Stockton. I find the recorder's office, fill out the paperwork, show my ID, pay a nominal fee and get a copy of my "Josie's" death certificate. Yes! My Josephine McCormick Adney, daughter of John McCormick, born 1871 in Wisconsin, widow of Chris Adney, and buried in Tracy. She was there all the time, even though I "knew" it couldn't be her—I was happy to be so wrong.

When my children asked if I'd like to do anything special the next Mother's Day, I said "Yes, how about visiting my great grandmother's grave?" They turned me down but I did visit my Josie shortly thereafter.

Research Notes

San Joaquin County Public Library Obituary Index File, 1850-1991

This collection, now available at FamilySearch.org, consists of images of index cards located at the San Joaquin County Public Library in Stockton, California. The index cards contain clippings of obituaries from various San Joaquin County and Stockton city newspapers. There are over 167,000 images which can be browsed or you can search by sections of the alphabet. What you will see is the actual image of the obituary as it appeared in the newspaper.

Mocavo.com – a search engine for genealogy

You might want to try this fairly new search engine which limits your searches to genealogy sites only. This free search engine searches thousands of genealogy sites. This helps eliminate those searches on a regular search engine that bring up all kinds of commercial and other websites that have nothing to do with genealogy.

San Mateo County Records, 1856-1967

Among the many records being added at FamilySearch.org are the San Mateo County Records. These records include marriage intentions, naturalizations, deeds, patents, homesteads, and military service discharges. This collection is still being added to and has more than 647,000 images. Most of these are land records at the moment, such as deeds and patents, but other records may be mixed in with them. The grantor/grantee indexes are at the beginning of the list, before all the land records.
