The Fun Genealogy Discoveries We Have Made Recently

For November, our members shared some of their latest finds and interesting nuggets of research techniques they have gained. Some will be discussed in greater detail either later in this issue or in another issue. Here is a brief summary of most of those who shared with us at the November meeting:

Shari Stetson spoke about estrays. An estray is an animal, such as cattle, which has escaped from its owner. While doing newspaper research, she came across an advertisement placed on December 7, 1847 regarding some strays her ancestor, William R. Dillon, her 3rd great-grandfather, was trying to return to their rightful owners. She found it on Genealogy Bank, a source she has searched before.

Shari's message to us all is, even if you have checked a repository, regularly revisit the site to see if they have added any new collections. You might find a tidbit on an ancestor that was not available a year or two before.

While visiting his home town, **Wayne**

Wallace found some World War 1 (Great War) portraits of his father. There was also a panoramic photo taken of his father's high school classmates feasting on watermelon. His relative had half of the photo. He had the other half. He now has copies of both, framed separately, but which put together show the full picture.

Another member (sorry, I didn't catch the name) also shared a story of an ancestor who died in a duel over a woman. His widow married one year and one day after his death. The reason: his will stipulated that for her to inherit she wasn't to marry for at least a year.

Sydna Wallace shared an 1840's letter. Her mother's uncle possessed six copies of it and gave her a copy.

Anne Field shared a success she



has had with her family history website. She encourages people to write to her if they have information or if she can help. She has a third great-grandfather who has been in both Manitoba, Canada and California. She has been looking for this connection for years. Someone who had the missing link connected with Anne through her website and provided the missing link.

Anne also shared her latest family history book she has made for her family. She also shared a book of maps for Jefferson County, Illinois which has been helpful in her family research.



Rosalie Heppner shared more of her quest to verify the ancestry of her father who was born in 1911 and adopted at birth. In July she shared her success with DNA which allowed her verify that she had indeed identified the

family line from which he was descended. While researching back east, she was given a photograph of her biological great-grandfather.

We will do a feature article on her research journey for this family line in a future article.



Darel Scoggin shared a PowerPoint of his research success on one of his family lines, the Keith & Bess Durbin story, complete with some great family photographs. We will feature more details in a future newsletter article.

Stephanie McLeod shared some information on her Minnick line. The Müench family, with the "ch" having a "k" sound, were clerics to the pope in the 800's. The spelling of the family name was changed to Minnick when they came to America because that was how it sounded. She found information about this family on Wikipedia. We will feature more about this family in a separate article.

A few Genealogy Tools and Hints

As my parents came from large family, I am always looking for the best way to share their family histories & photos with them. Mom was the 21st out of 22 children. Pop was the 7th out of 11 children. 52 First cousins on just mom's side.

So here are a few inexpensive or free software programs that I use to share our ancestors' information:

1. **Screen Snipping Tool:** Being able to screen capture anything on the computer screen is such a big asset.

I have a snipping tool that came with computer.

My wife has MWSnap, and Chrome has "Lightshot", a screenshot tool. Caution on free stuff from computer WebPages as they sometimes come with malware: know your source.

- 2. **Photo software:** The Free Picasa has been updated to Google Photos. We all need photo software!
- 3. **PowerPoint:** Show & Tell Family Trees to Family: **Microsoft Office comes with this program, just outstanding!**
- 4. **YouTube:** To find out how to do anything: www.YouTube.com and ask anything! **Free.**
- 5. Conversion of audio and visual tapes to digital: www.Southtree.com

TAPES FILM PHOTOS AUDIO

There is a **COST**, but sign up for their emails and they send 30-40% discounts quite often. Would like to hear if other MCGS members have a source for this conversion also? Costco does side photo conversion to DVDs for 29 cents each, in batches.

- 6. Working with digital audio: www.Audacity.com a totally **FREE** open sourced with great help. YouTube help also.
- 7. **Special graphics:** <u>www.images.Google.com</u> Thousands of **FREE** images real or cartoons. Use your snipping tool.

Sharing your Genealogy Work with others:

Share your work with the various Genealogy Programs like Ancestry.com & the free FamilySearch.org. But - - But -

If the family members are not into doing the all the work, but would like to look over your shoulder:

To Share: Use the PowerPoint as program to add all inputs, like photos, scans, text, and family trees.

Install it on a DVD: DVDs have 4.7 Gigabytes, but as technology is advancing and devices are getting smaller, computers, laptops and others are eliminating DVD drives. If you are using a DVD, purchase one of the label makers like Memorex, then you can fancy up a nice DVD label with photos, backgrounds and inserting text boxes. 100 DVDs



cost under \$30.00 at Amazon Prime.

Install it on a thumb drive/memory stick: The smallest/ cheapest 8 Gigabyte size I found on Amazon

Prime was under \$30.00 for a 10 pack. The difficulty is putting a label on it. Here are 2 scans of the finished DVD and thumb drive.
