# April Meeting: Developing a Four Generation Chart Program for the Merced County Genealogical Society Discussion led by Shari Stetson



The genealogical society is focusing this year on strengthening the four generation chart program for its members. We ask all

members to print off as many four generations charts as you need, fill them out and bring them to the next meeting. The officers will continue to accept four generation charts.

Here is how the program works. Complete the chart with the surnames, date ranges and localities of your ancestors. Circle the number(s) of the ancestors you are researching right now. As these charts are turned in, a record will be made of where you are searching so if you wish you may contact and share locality research information with others. Also, as the book committee makes decisions on which books to buy for our collection in the Doris Cochran Research room, it will be helpful to know where our members are focusing their research.

If you are searching beyond your greatgrandparents, you may wish to use the name of a parent or grandparent in the number one position on the chart.

Each member is assigned an alpha-numeric code by surname, with only certain authorized members having access to that list. Each four generation chart turned in will be notated with the member's code. The program will provide two possible services.

First, the surnames, and possibly coupled with the localities and dates, will be made available to members. Members will then be able to identify who else may be researching for the same surname in the same locality and join forces and share information.

Second, it is proposed that the surnames along with the assigned alpha-numeric code be made available on the internet to the general public.

Interested parties may send a query with their research information and ask the member to contact them. The member will then be notified a contact has been requested. It will be up to the member whether or not he or she responds.

One of the primary objectives along with sharing information and collaborating on research is to protect the privacy of the members.

To make this program work, as a society we would need to determine how to organize the information. Should we use a database program, or something like an excel worksheet? In the past, surname sheets were kept in a binder in the Doris Cochran Room. We would continue to do so, but if we decide to share the surnames online, we need to decide on an appropriate format.

Albert lived until 1943. He became forgetful, so he lived with his daughter Bertha the last year or two of his life. He died on 26 Aug 1843 and is buried with his first wife, Johanna, in the Saint John Lutheran Cemetery.

The first part of the paragraph at the bottom of page 4, column 1 should read:

Martha was widowed in 1956 while she was living in Ellinwood, KS. Bill Schroeder was buried in Lakin Comanche Cemetery; Ellinwood, Barton County, Kansas. Martha died in 1980 and was buried in the same cemetery.

# Case Study: Schmanke Family of Alma, Wabaunsee, Kansas

In the process of working with member Michele Moore to put together her Schmanke family of Alma, Kansas history, we ran across several discrepancies that raised questions. When she started, she learned of three Schmanke brothers who came from Prussia in the 1800's and settled in this community, Albert, her direct ancestor, August and Ferdinand (Ferdenand). Alma, Kansas ended up attracting a fairly large group of Prussian settlers during that era.

However, as we fine-tuned some details in her research, it became apparent there were multiple Schmanke men in Alma, Kansas with the same or similar names. Who were her direct ancestor's brothers, and how were they all connected?

When Michele started, she knew of three men named Ferdinand Wilhelm Schmanke, August Albert Schmanke and Albert Ferdinand Schmanke who, on a genealogy.com User Tree were listed as the sons of Michael and Minnie or Martha Schmanke, estimated marriage year about 1844 in Germany.

A search on Ancestry and FamilySearch failed to produce records that could be identified as these parents. Records for men named Michael and a surname fairly close to Schmanke were found in Polish Catholic records. However, based on the church attendance and burial places of the most the family in the United States, the family appeared to be *Evangelisch* or Lutheran.

By looking at various records, Michele and I were able to determine there was two August Schmankes and two Ferdinand Schmankes in Alma—all within the same age range. Only a few months ago, after ancestry.com make some changes to their format, I ran across a family tree for this family which listed five names as sons of this same family. The given names of the parents were not known.

One question that quickly came to mind was why would parents name living children the same first names with different middle names? It is common in some Hispanic Catholic communities to give the first name of male children Jose (sometimes Maria) to all sons and Maria to all daughters. The children are known by their second name. However, we knew of no such practice in the *Evangelisch* Lutheran faith. What I do know from research done on my own

Prussian ancestry is that it is common for middle names to be the given names of godparents.

The question arose: Are all five of the Schmanke men in Alma, Kansas siblings? Are some of them cousins to three brothers? Are they related at all? I found it interesting that on the 1915 Kansas census, F.L. and Henrietta Schmanke were enumerated right next to Aug A and Caroline Schmanke.

I put together a chart of some of the information gathered about these five Schmanke men. When no middle name or initial was used, sometimes the only way to distinguish one from another was their birth year, the name of their spouse, or the middle name. By doing so, I came to the conclusion the five Schmanke men definitely knew each other and probably had a familial relationship. However, I believe as Ms. Moore's early research shows, Ferdinand W., August Albert and Albert Ferdinand were brothers. The other two were possibly cousins.
