In Memory of...

The death of Charleen Orr Renteria, one of our long-time members, on February 13, has saddened all of us. We, of course, knew Charleen as a fellow genealogist, avidly tracing her family roots and making the trek with others in our group to Salt Lake City. We also remember her as our County Librarian, a position she held from 1994 until she retired in 2007. Charleen struggled during many of those years to keep the library system going with reduced hours and staff and for that we are all very grateful.

Charleen grew up in Idaho, graduated from Idaho State and received her Masters Degree in Library Science from the University of Hawaii. After working at the Twin Falls Public Library in Idaho, she moved to Merced and began working in the Merced County Library in 1972. It was there she met the man she was to marry, one of her colleagues, Phil Renteria. She

served in various positions at the library before taking over as County Librarian. It was Charleen who helped find us a room in the library which could house our collection as well as the many books which were given to us by the Genealogical Society of Stanislaus County and by others. This was the Doris Cochran Room, our new home – thank you so much, Charleen.

Charleen leaves behind her husband, Phil, her two daughters, Roxanne and Alexandra, granddaughter Esmeralda. She will be buried in Hazelton Cemetery in Hazelton, Idaho, surrounded by many of her ancestors.
