

Use your time at home to re-energize your genealogy research.

Do you have stacks of boxes taking up your floor or piles of paper on your desk? Organize them. If you have a scanner, create digital copies of paper notes and get rid of the paper clutter permanently.

If you subscribe to genealogy sites, devote time to search them thoroughly—again, if a long time has passed since the last time you checked. There may be new information. Some websites are adding new content all the time. Remember to check them. Some old but effective favorites (and they are free to use):

Family History: Where Do I Start?

In February, Robyn Echols gave a PowerPoint presentation of ways you and family members can prepare to start your genealogy research by organizing at home.

The first task to do is interview older family members to learn what they know about the family. Second, start gathering documents, images, artifacts, mementos—anything that will tell you about your family and heritage. The talk also touched on labeling photos, affixing a note on the back on family items who it originally belonged to, the approximate age, and other details. Also, images of items saved to the computer can have their file name changed to basic information about date, person it belonged to, etc.

When storing your paper records, do so in acid-free containers. Sheet protectors are wonderful for important documents. For your digital records, save them in more than



one place. Have several back-ups of your information. Consider keeping your digital files on a "cloud" program. Share your digital files with other family members.
