Our September Program: FDR's Alphabet Soup

Your editor was not at the meeting, so many thanks to Robyn Echols, who took notes. The following covers some of the very interesting talk that Cath Madden Trindle gave. She also had a handout. Those who need the handout, please ask.

Most people were touched by at least one government program during the Great Depression. When looking for records from the New Deal era, keep in mind that if the states ran the programs, then the records will be at the state level.

WPA – The artistic brank of the federal programs and the best known. Lots of information is available.

CCC – The Civilian Conservation Corps. All federal employee records are kept in the St. Louis, Missouri regional repository. Privacy issues apply, so need the next of kin to send for CCC (or any other) employment records. The Conservation Corps Museum in San Luis Obispo can be found online.

FCA – Farm Credit Administration. Helped with loans to keep people on the land. Still in place today and has its own archive webpage.

FSA – Farm Security Administration. Help for those who walked off their farms and had no place to go.

FSA – Federal Security Agency. Has records of the nursing corps in the 1930s & 1940s.

MLB - Maritime Labor Board. Information on merchant marine ancestors.

USMC – US Maritime Commission. More information on merchant marines, including records of sailors on ships.

Look who's in the 1940 census!

These are the parents of your newsletter editor, Anne Field. The census was taken on 9 April 1940 on Manoa Road in the Manoa Valley in Honolulu. Here they are, shortly before their marriage in May, 1940, Jean Fick and Chuck Healy, with Diamond Head in the background.

Jean (Catherine E.) was 19 and living with her parents, Lt. Cmdr. Harold F. Fick and Frances Brent Fick, her sister, Frances L., and her mother's sister, Isabelle E. Brent on Manoa Road.

Further along Manoa Road, was Charles E. Healy, 26, living in a house with several others – all U.S. Navy aviators, one of them married. His wife was the "house mother."

Jean and Chuck met at a party not long after she arrived in July 1939 and they were engaged in December. After their wedding they moved into a little house in Pearl City where they lived until November 1941 when they headed to California on the SS *Lurline*. No idea what happened to the house they left behind as it was right in the path of the Japanese bombers in the little valley behind Pearl Harbor. So glad my dad had orders to California!

Beulah (Bea) Anderson January 22, 1921 - August 27, 2012

Beulah (Bea) was born in Winton, California on January 22, 1921 to Edward and Florence Roedell. Bea was a 1938 graduate of Livingston High School, and Heald Business College in San Jose, California in 1939.

On March 17, 1940, she married Jay Anderson, and they lived in Merced most of their marriage. During World War II, she traveled with Jay to his various duty stations. While Jay was stationed in India, she worked for Jimmy Uhle in his accounting office. She also was a youth leader with Camp Fire Girls and a supporter of various youth activities in Merced.

Bea is survived by daughter Karen (Daryl) Poppen of Keyes, CA; daughter Jayne (Rich) Price of Mt. Hermon, CA; 3 grandsons; 2 great grandsons; a great granddaughter; and her niece, Ilene Faust, whom she considered another daughter. She was preceded in death by her husband, her parents, her brother Arnold, and grandson Greg Poppen.

Bea was a member of the Daughters of the American Revolution, Merced Women's Club, Merced Genealogical Society, Woman-to-Woman Bible Studies, and Central Presbyterian Church. She will be remembered as a loving wife, caring mother, grandmother, and great grandmother, and a devoted friend. She was a faithful servant of Jesus Christ, and she entered into heaven on August 27, 2012.
