30 Years Ago – From *The Family Snoop* – January 1988

NAME THAT NEWSLETTER CONTEST

Two new suggestions have been turned in: ROOT NOTES, and IN THE BEGINNING. Are there any more entries? You now have a new board, so your editor will be guided by their wishes.

In response to one of the criticisms in last year's newsletter contest, this year's newsletter pages will be numbered consecutively for the whole volume. Therefore, the February issue will begin with page 6.

CALENDARS

As we begin a new year, a brief discussion of calendars seems appropriate. The following are the ones we are most likely to find, and on page 5 is a calendar for the years 1776 to 2080.

QUAKER DATES

The Quaker dating system used the same calendar as everyone else, except they used numbers instead of day and month names. Thus before January of 1752, the year began with March as the first month, and July would have been the fifth month, old style. After 1752 July would be the seventh month, new style. ---from the "Iowa Genealogical Society Newsletter"

FIRST FRENCH REPUBLIC CALENDAR

On 5 October 1793 the government changed the French calendar to one based on an ancient Egyptian calendar, with September 22, 1792, the start of the French Revolution used as New Year's Day. Each month had 30 days, with 5 holidays at the end of the year. A lenghty article, complete with names of the months, can be found in "Antique Weekly" for 25 November 1985.

JULIAN-GREGORIAN CALENDARS

Julius Caesar established the calendar basically as we know it. It had 365 days with a leap day every 4 years. Eventually this added too many days to the year, so in 1582 Pope Gregory XIII ordered the 10 days between 4 October 1582 and 15 October 1582 dropped from the calendar, and each year to begin on 1 January. The Catholic Countries adopted this immediately, but England held out until 2 September 1752, when they had to drop 11 days. To add to the confusion the English New Year started on 25 March, but the whole month of March was considered as the first month of the year. Therefore, in the Julian (Old Style) Calendar, George Washington was born on 11 February 1731, and in the Gregorian (New Style) Calendar he was born on 22 February 1732. Confused? The moral of the story is: Always write down the dates as they appear in the original, and note the source. Abstracted from the "Lorain County Researcher", (Ohio)
