Merced County Genealogical Society Members: Invitation to use the Family History Center Premium Websites

At our June 2018 MCGS meeting we had six visitors from the Family History Center. They invited all our MCGS members to come and use their genealogical research facility and computers with15 web based programs including the help from their support staff. I met with them and now reporting on what I found:

First: We have genealogical treasure trove near us that is being underutilized. The "Family History Center Premium Websites" are very rich with genealogical data from many countries. The Family History Center is behind the LDS Church at 1080 E. Yosemite Ave, here in Merced and they have open arms for all visitors and they will help you with your own genealogical research. Note: The folks there want it to be known they do not proselytize (ask for your membership in the church).

The Family History Center has 8 computers with 15 genealogical web based programs (listed on the next 3 pages), including their famous FamilySearch program. All computers operate from their web portal that can access these programs, with a 45 Mb connection speed. They have a few hard wired cable internet plugs for your own laptop, and a wireless system which is slower. We can use all the websites, some will require your own family tree to be on the FamilySearch website to work, and other programs don't require that. Some of the programs are full access; some are the "library edition" like the Ancestry site that does not have the "World Explorer". However the other websites available here will cover North & South America, British Isles, Scandinavia, all of Europe, Asia/Pacific and South Africa!

I consider myself somewhat of a power user of Ancestry and AncestryDNA, but my eyes have been opened to the power of some of these programs and will certainly employ these new tools in my research as I plug in some of my large family into FamilySearch!

All this is FREE! Free usage, Free copies, Free support from the staff, and you can download your research to your computer, memory stick, or CD/DVD.

At Home - The main FamilySearch website: www.FamilySearch.com Free, just sign up and include a password.

Training and more: www.FHC.FamilySearch.org (same pass word as FamilySearch). We can have access to these items: The Family History Guide, My Family Booklet, FamilySearch Blog, FamilySearch Research Wiki, and FamilySearch Help Center.



FamilySearch Adds 2 Billionth Image of Genealogy Records

In your quest to discover your family history it might be time to take another look at FamilySearch's online offerings. The genealogy giant's free online databases of digitized historical documents have now surpassed 2 billion images of genealogy records with millions more being added weekly from countries around the world. Nonprofit FamilySearch, a global leader in historical genealogy records preservation and access, announced the milestone today.

Last September FamilySearch transitioned from its microfilm circulation services to a new digital model that makes its massive genealogical records collections more broadly and readily accessible online (See UPDATE: FamilySearch Digital Records Access Replacing Microfilm).

Today's announcement reinforces its continuing commitment to grow online genealogy resources. FamilySearch currently adds over 300 million new images a year online from its microfilm to digital and field operations efforts.

From Family History Center Team Member Anne Kratzer: As to why we invite everyone to the Family History Center.... The Tree in FamilySearch is unique in that it has come from the efforts of people the world over. The guideline is that for every person who has lived and died on the earth there should only be one individual record in the Tree for them. If you share a common ancestor with someone else, that common ancestor should only have one record and by working together in the same system, it allows us to deposit the images documenting their life in a central place enabling everyone to benefit from the knowledge gained by the research of many. We love helping our patrons learn to search out for themselves from the vast collection of documents we have digitized. The system works best if the people using it have been given some guidance in the beginning on how to properly input information. The system will then be able to do some searching for you. You may wake up one morning to find that it is giving you record hints that have just been made available though the volunteer FamilySearch Indexing program.

The 19th Century British Library Newspapers digital archive

This fully searchable database of the British Library's newspaper holdings, provides a complete run of 48 national

and regional Victorian British newspapers for the 19th century from 1800 to 1900. These support the study of colonial history, genealogical research, politics, urban studies and media courses.



Alexander Street Press - American Civil War

Research Data: Contains indexed, searchable information on over 4 million soldiers and thousands of battles, together with 15,000 photographs.

Letters and Diaries: Contains approximately 100,000 indexed pages of diaries, letters, and memoirs, including 4,000 pages of previously unpublished manuscripts, such as the letters of Amos Wood and his wife and the diary of Maryland planter William Claytor.

Images, Photographs, Posters, and Ephemera: Provides a vivid history of the American Civil War with over 1,400 images.

Social and Cultural History: Personal accounts of well-known historical figures.

Women and Social Movements in the United States: Organized around the history of women in social movements in the United States between 1600 and 2000 A.D.

This American Ancestors website is the site for the New England Historic Genealogical Society (NEHGS), the oldest genealogical society in the USA, and the most used genealogical society website in the World!



Newspaper Archive.com is the world's largest online newspaper archive. Featuring billions of articles from historical newspapers around the U.S. and the world, Newspaper Archive makes exploring history and genealogy easy and fun. Discover fascinating news in archived newspapers hundreds of years old – including obituaries, birth announcements, sports articles, comics, and more – to fill in the life stories you are interested in. Paper Trail

Provides 19th Century westward American migration documents. The Oregon-California Trail Association established a committee to create a computer database from information in original emigrant writings of the overland trails experience. Information on names, location, Indian encounters, mode of travel, routes and other interesting details.



ProQuest Obituary Listings

The ProQuest obituaries collection is a premier resource for genealogical and historical research. You can use the collection to search obituaries and death notices from prominent newspapers such as the New York Times (dating back to 1851). The collection includes both famous and lesser-known individuals and can be searched by name or by keywords appearing in the body of the article.



Puzzilla

Find new research opportunities on descendant lines in FamilyTree.



Access to birth, marriage and death records, Social Security Death Index family trees, census records, immigration records, court, land, and probate records, military records, directory lists, newspapers, family histories, reference materials, biographies, wills, gravestone photos, ship manifests, map collections, and yearbook collections.



ArkivDigital Online

Arkiv digital is the largest private provider of Swedish Church Records and other Historical Records online! All images are newly photographed color images of the original documents.

Bottom line is that I owe a lot to this organization: I am not a member, but in 1974, while living in Ventura, CA, the LDS Church offered several training classes for genealogy and I took 3 of these classes. From this training I wrote the 1978, 130 page book: "James Moore Coleman, His Ancestors and Descendants". It told of his 3 wives, 22 children, and all the grandchildren. At that time we had 501 descendants listed. I have 52 first cousins on my mom's Coleman side alone. This was all done before personal computers. So much easier now! - Darel Scoggin 7 July 2018
