ARE THOSE FAMILY "FACTS" TRUE?

One of my great-grandmothers was Minerva Jane Matheny who married Charles Chinn - he was Irish, not Asian. She was called Jane

She told several of her children and/or grandchildren that she (Jane) was the oldest of 15 children, was born in Ireland, had come to America at 15, and had married at 15. My aunt had "born in Ireland" put on Jane's tombstone.

Minerva Jane Matheny was the daughter of Micah Matheny (born 1809 Hardin Co. KY) and wife Mahala Pennington (born 1810 Barren Co. KY) who were married in 1829 in Schuyler Co. IL. Their oldest child, a son, was born in 1830 in Schuyler Co. IL, and Minerva Jane was born November 8, 1832, in Warren Co. IL. There were 8 more known children. Minerva Jane was married on May 1, 1852, at Winterset, Madison Co. Iowa, age 19, while her family was moving from Illinois to Oregon. She had her wedding breakfast sitting on the singletree of a wagon. She died in Yolo Co. CA on March 8, 1923, at age 90 years 7 months.

Fiction vs fact:

Minerva Jane Matheny born in Ireland == fact: born in 1832 in Illinois.

Minerva Jane Matheny came to America at age 15 == fact: born in America.

Minerva Jane Matheny oldest of 15 children == fact: had older brother, and 8 younger brothers and sisters. (There may be more younger siblings)

Minerva Jane Matheny married at age 15 == fact: married at age 19.

Conclusion: Enjoy your family stories, but prove them.

Rhode Island Cemeteries Database Project

Rhode Historical Cemeteries The Island Transcription Project and the resulting Rhode Island Cemeteries Database project was begun by genealogists in 1990 with the goal of entering all known transcriptions of cemeteries in Rhode Island into a database, then sending volunteers into the field with a printout to see which stones were still there and whether they were correctly transcribed. The cemeteries and the listings are primarily 1647-1900. Originally, there were thought to be 200,000 inscriptions in 2500 cemeteries. Since the project started. volunteers have now approximately 3.100 cemeteries in the state with an estimated 430,000 inscriptions. The pre-20th century data is over 95% complete. You can now search the Rhode Island Historical Cemetery Database Index for an ancestor buried anywhere in the state

To access the online Rhode Island Cemeteries Master Name Database Index, which shows name, dates of birth and death, and cemetery I.D., go to http://www.rootsweb.ancestry.com/~rigenweb/cemetery.

Only the Master Index is available through the RIGenWeb Project. The whole database, which includes name and maiden name indexes, are not online but a list of locations that have access to the database is included on the website.

LOCAL HISTORY



Heusner Ranch Family Gravesite


Bernard F. Heusner was born in 1861 at Buckeye Flat, El Dorado County, to German immigrants Conrad and Mary E. (Lorenzo) Heusner. The eldest of five children he grew to adulthood on the family ranch in Buckeye

In 1889, Bernard Heusner purchased the Odell Ranch just east of Shingle Springs near Buckeye Flat where he was born and raised. Bernard farmed this land until his death in 1937. Here Bernard and his wife Marie raised their three children: Theodore, Cyril and Bernardena. Those of you who have been in the county for a while may have heard of Cyril "Cy" Heusner. Cy Heusner was on the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors from 1934 to 1957. When Marie Heusner passed away in 1917, she was buried on the east side of a small hill on the ranch. Two years later, their baby granddaughter, Roberta, Cy's daughter, passed away and was buried next to her grandmother. Later, at Bernard's passing in 1934, he also was buried next to his wife.

These are the only the three interments at this site. Other family members are buried in other sites in the vicinity. The land where the burial site is located is still owned by the family.

The site is located just east of Shingle Springs on the south side of Mother Lode Drive between Holiday Lake Drive and Ridge Drive at the wide spot in the road.
