STATE CENSUS RECORDS

State Census Records are available in a few states, such as Colorado, Florida, Illinois, Iowa, Maine, Nebraska, New York, and North Carolina. I located them on the website at: www.ancestry.com. They are mostly done in the years of 1885 and 1895; which helps the gap of the missing 1890 Federal Census Records. However, some can be found by just searching by the State in which you are researching.

MY BRICK-WALL SOLUTION

When I decided to get involved in genealogy, I knew I would be facing an almost impossible circumstance when I began researching my maternal great grandfather. Rumor was that five of his children passed away within twenty-one days of each other and had been buried in a pasture in North Dakota, USA. How could I find their burial location? Why were they buried in a pasture? Why did they pass away so young?

About two months later, I had received a letter from Mrs. D. Brown, of Seattle, Washington, USA. Included was a copy of a newspaper article from the Emmons County Record, Linton, North Dakota, dated Wednesday, June 3, 1981. The article was written nearly 84 years after the five children died. They all passed away between July 16, 1897 and August 6, 1897. Their ages were between two and thirteen years of age. They were the children of Herman E. and Threse Stermer.

Brick-wall Solution (Continued)

Their hand-made grave stone reads:

Heir is resting in God

Rutolf Stermer, born 09 Nov 1890, died 16 Juli 1897

Rosa St b. 6 OK 1884, d. 16 Juli 1897 Tina St b. 22 S'm 1892, d. 25 Juli 1897 Ida St b. 27 dez 1888, d. 25 Juli 1897 Kati St b 9 May 1895 d. 6 Aug. 1897

"God, Let them Rest in Peace"

NOTE: St Abbreviation for Stermer, S'm for September, OK for October, Juli for July, and Dez for December

Yes, my brick-wall was torn down all at once! The children died of Black Diphtheria, a highly contagious and deadly disease. They could not be transported to the Holy Trinity Krassna Cemetery. All of this information was on the first page of the newspaper along with a photo of the grave site!

Then, I had to prove that all of the information was correct and would meet the standards of the genealogical world! The sources, repositories, and citations had to be located. Along with the answers to my brick-wall dilemma came many additional challenges.

Who made the headstone? Who was Mrs. D. Brown? Who buried the children? What were they buried in? What was their mother's maiden name? Were they born in America?

I began corresponding with the owner of the newspaper and his friend, the author of a cemetery book. They sent me photos and other information about other relatives buried in or near Emmons County, North Dakota.

WHAT IS A WEBINAR?

A webinar is an online class that can be viewed in the comfort of our own home. The things that we need are an internet connection, computer's microphone and speakers (VoIP). "<u>Go-ToWebinar</u>" section and read the check list for tips on using your computer's microphone and speakers. A headset is recommended! (Or, you can select to "Use Telephone" after joining the Webinar).

The System Requirements are PC-based attendees with Windows® 8, 7, Vista, XP or 2003 Server.

For Mac users attendees you must have a Mac OS ®X10.6 or newer.

For Mobile attendees your must have an iPhone®, iPad®, Android™ phone or Android Tablet.

The webinar requires pre-registration. When you register, you will be sent confirmation and instructions to follow to get on the site. Many are free of cost. When you pre-register, you have the option to download the speaker's handouts, but only if you listen to it as it is being broadcasted. If you find that you cannot listen to it when it is first aired, please cancel so that they can let someone else register in your place. However, if you should forget to listen to the live presentation, it is available for about a week afterward. However, you cannot obtain the handouts.

The webinar sites also provided archives of previous presentations. Webinars allow genealogists the opportunity to learn about what they are in need of. Whether you are a beginner or a seasoned researcher there are topics that will fit your needs.

NOW, WHAT HAPPENS TO YOUR PERSONAL ANCESTRAL FILES (PAF's)?

The Personal Ancestral File (PAF) has been discontinued and is now being worked into the RootsMagic 6 software and utilizing the RootsMagic 6 webinars. RootsMagic 6 has many features that the PAF did not do. Like many genealogists, you've probably used Personal Ancestral File (PAF) for years. Unfortunately, it's no longer being updated or supported.

RootsMagic 6 is a Genealogy Software that allows you to record, research, and share your family history. It is being developed and updated to supporting the latest operating systems and genealogical technologies. RootsMagic 6 can be used for book publishing, color coding, wall charts, and shareable CD's. Your family goes running straight off of a flash drive, interactive problem lists, online publishing, a mobile application, and more!

Plus, RootsMagic 6 is certified to share and collaborate with <u>FamilySearch Family Tree</u>. See for yourself why more people use RootsMagic 6 to work with FamilySearch than any other program.

Their webinars need to be purchased at this time. They are bundled into sets for the cost of \$9.95. It is still less expensive than attended a live seminar out of town!

Another lesson that I have learned over my years of researching is that my knowledge is always stimulated in some way through any speech, website, or webinar. What we learn about one program can also be applied as we work within our own program.

As I burn a candle while working on this thing called Genealogy, I truly know that two ends are not enough.

Remembering our next meeting will be very easy.
