Instructions for filling up the column headed "Rank, Profession, or Occupation."

A person following more distinct Occupations than one, should insert each of them in the order of their importance.

- 1. The Titles of PEERS and other PERSONS OF RANK to be inserted as well as any important office they may hold. 2. MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT, MAGISTRATES, ALDERMEN, and other important public Officers, to state their profession or occupation, if any, after their official rank or title. 3. All persons serving in the ARMY AND NAVY, to state their rank and the branch of the service to which they belong. 4. All persons in the CIVIL SERVICE to state their rank, and the department or branch to which they belong...

Extracts from the Census (Ireland) Act, 1900, 63 Vic., cap. 6.

Sec. 2 (5) "Every Enumerator may ask all such questions of all persons within his district, respecting themselves or the persons constituting their respective families, and respecting such further particulars as may be necessary for the purpose of taking the said accounts." Sec. 7 (2) "If any person refuses to answer or wilfully gives a false answer to any question necessary for obtaining the information required to be obtained under this Act, he shall for each offence be liable on conviction under the Summary Jurisdiction (Ireland) Acts to a fine not exceeding five pounds: Provided that no person shall be subject to any such penalty for refusing to state his religious profession."
