Historic Preservation

On Thursday, October 20, 2011, there was a Dedication of the 'Lovell's Landing' Florida State Marker.

Partnering with Orange County, the Apopka Historical Society.

"In 1872, William A. Lovell purchased 225 acres on the north side of Lake Apopka ... to serve as a hub for freight service ...Before steamer service began on the Ocklawaha in 1882, fruits and vegetables from 17 landings around the lake were brought to Lovell's Landing for delivery by oxen to Clay Springs and areas further north"
