



An Introduction to Genealogy

The Genealogical Society of Okaloosa County (GSOC) will be holding their fall program in Crestview on November 16th at 10:30. Jon Sheperd will be presenting An Introduction to Genealogy.

Jon has been doing genealogy research for many years. He teaches at the Center for Lifelong Learning, and is a past president of the GSOC.

After the presentation, Jon and other members of the Society will be available to answer questions.

The GSOC meets on the fourth Saturday of each month (except December) at 10:30 in the Fort Walton Beach Library. The Society also holds periodic presentations and workshops at other locations in Okaloosa County.

Newspaper Research at the Susan Meyers Learning Resources Center at Northwest Florida State College

The Northwest Florida Daily News dates from Feb. 7, 1946. If you are searching for an earlier item, please try the Okaloosa News Journal or the Pensacola News Journal. The Fort Walton Beach Public Library has the Okaloosa News Journal newspapers on microfilm. The John C. Pace Library at the University of West Florida has both the Okaloosa News Journal and the Pensacola News Journal on microfilm.

Northwest Florida State College Susan Meyers Learning Resource Center has morgue books and microfilm for the Northwest Florida Daily News. The newspaper refers callers to the Meyers LRC.

The morgue books, actual paper copies of the newspaper by month, housed at the Meyers LRC date from July 1, 1980, to Jan. 1, 2011. Microfilm dates from Feb. 7, 1946, to Aug. 31, 2018. Individual newspapers from Sep. 1, 2018, to current are available.

There is no public index for the entire Daily News and a day-by-day search is required to find items if the date is not known. If you have a name and a date for an obituary or the title of an article, you may call the Meyers LRC at 850-729-5318 and a librarian will help you. There are two aggregated data bases accessible in the Myers LRC which cover 1988-2016, U.S. Southeast NewsStream, Jan 1988-Nov 2016 and Florida Newspapers (Newsbank) 2006-2016.

However, there is an index that dates from approximately early 1989 until August 4, 2017. There are some high-profile events that have been archived to the index as well. The Meyers LRC also has morgue books of the Bay Beacon that date from Jan. 1, 1999, to Dec. 31, 2017. Individual newspapers are available from Jan 1, 2018, to current.
