JULY 27, 2019, 10:30 AM "Lineage Societies" Presentation by Donna Ortman:



When people get involved in genealogy, a lot of them will eventually become interested in Lineage Societies. 
The WORLD WAR I GENEALOGY RESEARCH GUIDE, by Debra M. Dudek

This 104-page book is jam-packed with information about record collections, repositories, and search strategies. The author's knowledge and suggestions are particularly helpful if your World War I ancestors' Official Military Personnel Files (OMPF's) were destroyed in the 1973 fire at the National Personnel Records Center in St. Louis, Missouri. She also provides recommendations for learning more about your ancestor's military service unit, and about females who served as nurses or as volunteers.


