





Call to order: 10:24 am

Approval of Dec, Minutes: Sue moved the minutes be approved and Jerry seconded – they were approved. **Approval of Jan. Minutes:** Sue moved the minutes be approved and Jerry seconded – they were approved.

Finance Report – Phil: Bank Balance: \$1653.80 with blue box balance of \$594.64.

Membership Report – Jerry: 80% of the members have renewed. He has received many this morning. **Genealogy Report – Margaret:** Feb 27 – RootsTech.org – educational conference from Salt Lake. Some of it is online. After the conference has ended, they will post videos. Some of the videos will be free. Last year's presentations are online. Margaret has sent out a reminder blog. Margaret received an obituary request. The person had an incorrect death date. Margaret was able to correct the date. But couldn't find the obituary. **Family History Fair Status** – March 9 at the LDS church in Fort Walton Beach. Jon, Cindy, Hilma and Margaret are presenting.

Center for Life Long Learning (CLL) – Only two weeks remaining.

Activities – Cindy: Books from Valparaiso Library - Valparaiso decided to downsize their genealogy area. David (librarian) is keeping Florida and several other states. We had the first choice of other books. Mike and Cindy made the short notice trip to pull books. We pulled 3 bins and they are being in processed by the Fort Walton Beach library. We need to thank Ed Crosby, Mike, Kay Hamilton (Valparaiso Commissioner) and Tricia Gould for helping us keep these books in Okaloosa County.

Presentation to Okaloosa County Public Library Cooperative - Mike and Cindy were asked to attend the meeting. We gave a short presentation on GSOC, gave the attendees Cindy's contact information and a flyer to take with them. We asked for their ideas on how to reach the rest of the county. We received a positive response.

Oral History assistance request - referred to Dr. Jamin Wells at UWF for Fred Pryor

Other reports: Jon wants to continue to have lunches. Some people have an interest in going to lunch after the meeting. Options: pick a place ahead of time or ad hoc after the meeting. Consensus was to pick the restaurant ahead of time. It will be announced during the meeting.

State of the Society – Cindy's Presentation attached:

- Journal historically full of historical information. Hard to publish records that aren't already published. Cost is about \$600 to print. Do we continue to put it out in the form it is today? Many organizations have gone digital. Need ideas for topics. We need members to give us ideas. Topic should be picked in the next few months'
- Support Libraries Need volunteers to assist in the Genealogy section at least one day a week. The library is open 10-6. Can do research while you are there! Will start with Wednesday 11am-6pm. Cindy passed out her contact information for people to contact her if they are interested in helping.
- Day of DNA, Crestview April is DNA month. Cindy needs a committee to decide what programs we
 will have and when to have it (Saturday or Tuesday). It was agreed Saturday will be better. No lunch at
 the library, either break for lunch or provide box lunches for a cost. Val, Sue, Margaret and others will
 send an email to Cindy that they will be on the committee. We can sell tickets on Event Bright to
 control the size of the event. Need flyers for the Family History Fair and CLL (before it ends).
- State of Genealogy Societies Societies are expected to be experts in the area. Projects are necessary.
 We are not experts in the area. We can direct people to what records are available. Project ideas were as follows. We agreed to start with the Quick Sheet. Barbara, and others agreed to help. At the next meeting we will decide what our project will be.
 - Create a quick sheet on county records
 - o Bible Photography day. This would create a unique record set for the library here
 - First Families of Okaloosa County
 - o Who do you think you are?
 - Cemetery Cleanup
 - Update our Cemetery Books
 - GPS entries for our cemeteries
 - Transcription/indexing project of a unique record set in the local area
 - Old churches
- Live Webinars are an option for our meetings.

Newsletter – Ed made sure that everyone received the email. Visitors will receive the newsletter for 3 months to try to encourage them to return.

Scrapbooks – Val: The scrapbooks are here for everyone to see. They have been copied and created a digital copy.
