# **An Introduction to Genealogy**

The Genealogical Society of Okaloosa County (GSOC) will be holding their fall program in Crestview on November 16th at 10:30. Jon Sheperd will be presenting An Introduction to Genealogy.

Jon has been doing genealogy research for many years. He teaches at the Center for Lifelong Learning, and is a past president of the GSOC.

After the presentation, Jon and other members of the Society will be available to answer questions.

The GSOC meets on the fourth Saturday of each month (except December) at 10:30 in the Fort Walton Beach Library. The Society also holds periodic presentations and workshops at other locations in Okaloosa County.

#### **MEET NEW MEMBER - BETSEY PLANTHOLT**



Where were you born? In Greenbelt, MD, a planned community built in 1936, eight miles from Washington, D.C. We lived there until I finished college and my parents retired and moved back to NC.

Have you lived in other places? Where? My husband and I lived 10 months in Gulfport, MS, when he was stationed there for Air Force electronics schooling. When he was sent to Eglin, we moved to Shalimar and later to Fort Walton Beach. We've been here many, many years and plan to never leave.

What is your background (Where did you work, what did you do, etc.?) Before I was married, I had a job in Grand Central Terminal in New York City where I worked as a social worker at Travelers' Aid. That was an interesting and fun job! Then I married and was a full-time mother until our kids grew up and left home. Then I went back to school to get my master's in counseling and Human Development so that I could find a job. First, I was a home visitor for a program that prevented child abuse and later became the program manager for Healthy Families, a national organization that teaches young mothers how to be better moms and prevent child abuse.

When did you start doing genealogy? We had an uncle who used to talk about family history, but we didn't pay much attention to what he said. Now I wished I had! I became more interested about 2006 and joined DAR in 2012.

What geographic areas have you researched? VA and NC, because both families were from the counties near that state line. I should find out more about France, Ireland, England, Whales, and Scotland where my ancestors formerly lived before the 1600s. I have also done some work on my husband's family, Plantholts and Kohlers, most of whom came from Germany, landing in Baltimore or Pennsylvania.

Have you attended any conferences? No, not yet.

**Do you belong to any other genealogy related societies?** In addition to DAR, I'm a member of the Halifax Co., VA, and Genealogical Society which mails me a newsletter four times a year. I'm also in the Patrick Henry Descendants' Group and am a director in the Fontaine Maury Society that meets annually in different locations nationally.

**Tell us about one of your brick walls.** ONE? You've got to be kidding, right? Lots, especially on Mama's side where, according to her, my 2<sup>nd</sup> g. grandfather is <u>William Wiley Warren</u>. I even have a good photo of him with my 2<sup>nd</sup> g. grandmother, but can't find him anywhere online.

Have you DNA tested? Not yet. I'm still studying about it.

**Does one of your ancestors have an unusual name?** Unity West (5 g. grandmother). Her mother, Martha West Woodward (her middle name, West, was also later her married name), married 3 husbands and had children with all three men and I'm <u>directly descended from her</u> with <u>each</u> of those <u>3 men</u>! She's my 5 g. grandma through her husband Gillian Macon; 5 g. grandma through husband William Bigger; and 6 g. grandma through Nathaniel West. As the generations trickled down through all the various names and couples, I'm at the bottom of each of the three family blood lines. Very strange!

**Do you have an ancestor you would consider famous?** Patrick Henry, 3 greats grandfather; First Lady Martha Dandridge Washington, 1<sup>st</sup> Cousin 6<sup>th</sup> degrees removed; Virginia Gov. Alexander Spotswood, 6 g. grandfather; Virginia Gov. Col. John West, 8 g. grandfather; King of Scotland Robert I de Bruce (1274 – 1329), 15 greats grandfather; and Charlemagne (742-814).

If you could ask one ancestor a question, who would you ask and what would the question be? I'd ask Samuel Smith Brandon, one of my great grandfathers on Mama's side, where he is buried. Since there were three Samuel Smith Brandons all born in the same county from about 1837-1939, it's difficult to prove which one he is, because the censuses aren't accurate, there are no birth certificates, and other information is sketchy, if available. I'd also ask Patrick Henry why he didn't leave any writings or speeches as his legacy like others did during that time period.
