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Genealogical Proof Standard

The **Genealogical Proof Standard** (GPS) is a guideline for establishing the reliability ("proof") of a genealogical conclusion with reasonable certainty. It is important within the genealogical community for clearly communicating the quality of research performed, such as by a professional genealogist. It is also useful for helping new genealogists understand what is needed to do high-quality research.

It has five elements:

- a reasonably exhaustive search;
- complete and accurate source citations;
- · analysis and correlation of the collected information;
- · resolution of any conflicting evidence; and
- a soundly reasoned, coherently written conclusion.^[1]

Standard #1 Reasonably exhaustive search

- Assumes examination of a wide range of high quality sources.
- Minimizes the probability that undiscovered evidence will overturn a too-hasty conclusion.

Standard #2

Complete and accurate citation of sources

- Demonstrates the extent of the search and the quality of the sources.
- Allows others to replicate the steps taken to reach the conclusion. (Inability to replicate the research casts doubt on the conclusion.)

Standard #3

Analysis and correlation of the collected information

- Facilitates sound interpretation of the data contributed by each source.
- Ensures that the conclusion reflects all the evidence.

Standard #4 Resolution of conflicting evidence

 Substantiates the conclusion's credibility. (If conflicting evidence is not resolved, a credible conclusion is not possible.)

Standard #5 Soundly reasoned, coherently written conclusion

- Eliminates the possibility that the conclusion is based on bias, preconception, or inadequate appreciation of the evidence.
- · Explains how the evidence led to the conclusion.

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between them? Did Abigail live to marry and have children? Was she still living when her brother left for America? Did Dennis emmigrate already married with wife Ellen Donovan (important family in area, see ruins of Castle Donovan in Drimoleague, history of close linke with McCarthys)? Search of ships records so far unavailing. If could discover what year he left passenger lists might give who traveled with him & ages at time. Or did Dennis meet at Donovan locally in Vermont related to those back home?

And note considerable mystery over WHICH Dennis McC is shares tombstone with Honora in Bennington cemetery behind the museum. Lifespan of Son, Denis: Gravestone gives 1825--1910, making him 85 when he died. But his obituary appeared in the local paper just before Christmas 1907, giving age of death as 76. Another article writing of Honora before her death in 1901, after she hit her 3rd century, says she was residing with her son, who was then 75. So a mystery here. Other ages for son given in various articles intensify the confusion. The figures cannot be reconciled. Were there TWO Denis McCarthys? If so, what relation to each other and to Honora? And if Honora's son is NOT the one listed on headstone inscription, why wasn't he buried with his mother, where is he, and just which relative IS buried in grave? It is difficult to explain how a man's obituary can be published & a funeral take place in North Bennington a full THREE YEARS before he died...

WHEN IMMIGRATED to AMERICA: some local printed sources say both son Dennis and Honora arrived here in 1842 BEFORE Famine of 1847. (Did they travel together? Or did son establish farm & then send for her? Newspapers insist H. was ALREADY A GRANDMOTHER when she immigrated, implying son had time to establish a family. Who were these grandchildren? When born and where? How many? But obituaries state H. claim she left Ireland when she was 65, placing year of departure from
