## Campaign for the Fulgham/Fulghum Family National Museum and Library

The campaign to raise \$500,000.00 for the Fulgham/Fulghum Family National Museum and Library to be located in Smithfield, Virginia, is slowly coming together.

James E. (Jim) Fulghum of Wilson, North Carolina, the campaign Coordinator, reports that the plans for the campaign are solidifying. Meanwhile, he reports that some special gift pledges are being obtained from members of the family while efforts are being made to obtain tax exemption recognition from the Internal Revenue Service.

Plans call for additional efforts to obtain special gift pledges to pick up in 2004 as tax exemption is obtained. These initial steps will be followed by an advance gifts pledges effort to finish out the second phase of the campaign in late 2004. Fulghum will contact some members of the family in each state by telephone in the Advance Gifts stage. Then, in 2005, a general solicitation of all members of the family will take place in a mailing effort which will be the General Campaign stage.

"As we all know, this total campaign has to be in the family," Fulghum explained. No other group will be as interested in having a museum and library rising out of the ground where we had our start in 1641." It will be there for us to witness and for our children on into the future to view their heritage as our family continues its trek across mankind."

He called on members of the Family to start thinking about their involvement in this undertaking. "No one's responsibility is any greater than anyone else's, we're all in the Family," he explained.

The Subcommittee of the Marketing Committee will consist of J. Grant Fulgham, Dan N. Fulghum, Charles B. Ellis, Christian M.M. Fulghum, Peggy Fulghum Wood and Robert S. Fulghum, who will serve as Chair. The subcommittee will consider and inventory materials such as artifacts, memorabilia, exhibits and displays, and Library materials to be housed in the Museum/Library.

Robert S. Fulghum (Bob), Subcommittee Chair, adds, "The Fulgham/Fulghum National Museum and Library will provide Fulgh\*ms a unique opportunity to make their contribution to American History. Important Fulgh\*m artifacts and written materials housed therein will be of enormous interest -- not only to Family members but also to genealogists and professional historians. This is because of the fact that few families have the large database of family members and the large number of lineages of family members worked out. These along with the many stories of Fulgh\*ms, their daily life experiences, and their accomplishments that are being compiled and accumulated will serve as a unique historical resource."

We had heard so much about the heat wave in England that we were not sure what to expect on our arrival in Manchester. What a surprise when the Captain of our flight told us that the temperature that morning was 55 degrees. Great sweater weather for several days

One of the places we visited was the village of Taddington for the service of the blessing of its well. In earlier times, people worshipped their water gods by decorating their wells and springs with flowers. The custom is still held with beautiful decorations and a march from the church to the well at the top of the hill.

During the service the vicar introduced us and told the congregation that if anyone knew about the Foljambes that he was sure we would be interested. A gentleman came up to me and said he had four volumes of the "History of Derbyshire" which had quite a bit about the Foljambes. I was able to order these books and had them mailed to me. I will bring them to the reunion in Savannah.



### **MEET MY FAMILY GROUP, Part 5**

The Lineage of our family group, James Hooks and Frances Schmidt Fulghum is now thought to be as follows: Captain Anthony-Michael-Anthony-John-Matthew-James-Charles Mallory-James Hooks, Sr.



James Fulghum, 17 Jan 1825 - 22 Dec 1863

James Fulghum was born in Wayne County North Carolina 17 January 1825. He was the youngest son of Mathew Fulghum of Wayne County, NC. This Matthew Fulghum was born in Wayne County, NC in 1779. He married Sarah Dickinson in 1799 in Wayne County, North Carolina. Mathew died in 1827 (1) about a year after James was born. Sarah died in 1832. One of the daughters of this marriage was Elizabeth, born 1812 (she was about 20 when her mother, Sarah, died). This Elizabeth was the Elizabeth who moved to Georgia with James; thus, was the SISTER, not (as reported elsewhere) the mother, of James. Also moving to Georgia from this family were John Glen Fulghum, William Fulghum, Matthew Fulghum, and Jacob Duggan Fulghum as well as James. The move probably occurred after Sarah's death.

James was married to Jane Harrison Fulghum, born 20 September 1827 in Washington County, Georgia. In those days in rural Georgia, there often were not many eligible marriage partners. James and two of his brothers (John and Mathew) married three sisters of the Harrison family. James' wife, Jane, was a younger sister of John's wife, Elizabeth Duggan Harrison Fulghum (b. 1814) and Mathew's wife, Penelope Harrison Fulghum (b. 1815).

James was received on profession of faith in Bethlehem Church, Warthen, Georgia on 31 October 1842.

James served in the Army of the Confederate States of America. James was a member of Company H, 2<sup>nd</sup> Regiment, Georgia State Troops. In 1863, he petitioned the Adjutant General for a discharge so that he might return to his farm and ten children, all in need. While awaiting word of his request for discharge, James contracted a virulent pneumonia. His wife, Jane, went to him in his sickness since care for sick soldiers was very poor. While caring for James, Jane contracted the pneumonia from him. Both died of this virulent pneumonia, James on 22 December 1863 and Jane on 14 January 1864, leaving the ten children orphaned. James was buried in a family cemetery in Washington County, Georgia. Jane was buried at Bethlehem Church. James obituary was written by **Ivy W. Duggan**, also a Civil War soldier, who later served as a legislator in the Georgia Legislature.

Relatives and close friends raised the orphaned children. The Hooks family raised the ninth child, Charles Mallory Fulghum. Charles named one of his sons James Hooks Fulghum. James Hooks Fulghum did extensive work on the Fulgham-Fulghum family genealogy and history in the 1950's and 1960's.
