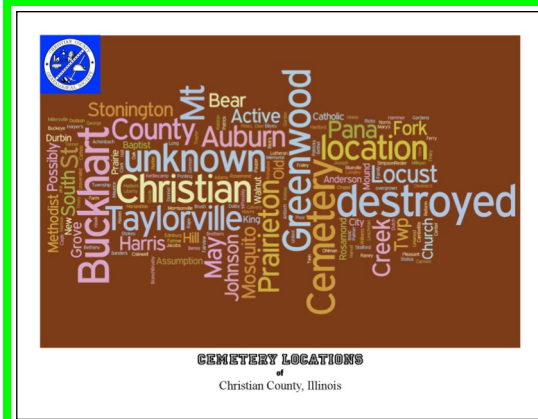

Contains 7 pages of transcriptions

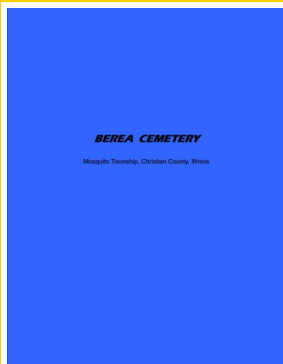
Kettlekamp Cemetery

Contains 45 pages of transcriptions.

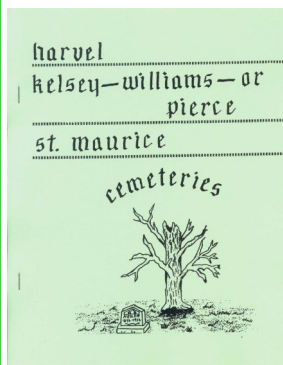


BEREA CEMETERY

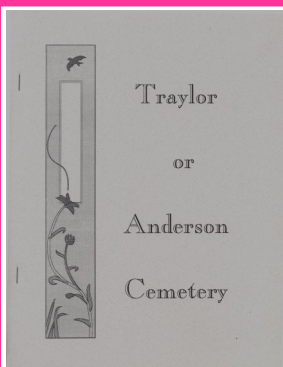
Located in Ricks Township there is a page dedicated to the beginning of the cemetery.

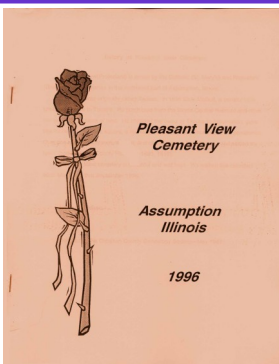


TRAYLOR OR ANDERSON CEMETERY

A brief history of this cemetery is included with a map of the readings.

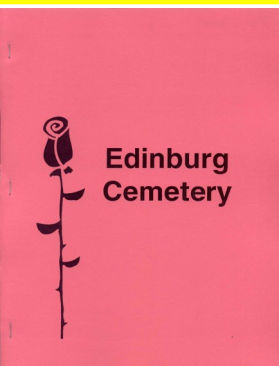
Located in Bear Creek Township it was transcribed in 1996 by Linda R. Adriano and Jennifer A. Slaney.

PLEASANT VIEW CEMETERY

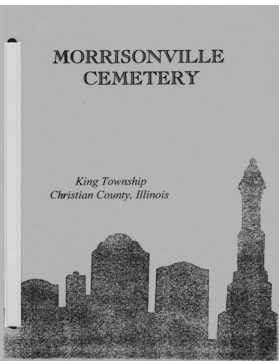
Beginning with a brief history of this cemetery located in Assumption Township and a map of the sections as read by Linda R. Adriano and Jennifer A. Slaney in 1996 the 36 pages of readings is a must for anyone locating their ancestors.



EDINBURG CEMETERY

Located in Buckhart Township this cemetery was transcribed by Jennifer A. Slaney in 1995.

It includes a map of the readings taken. This large, but yet small cemetery has 86 pages of readings.



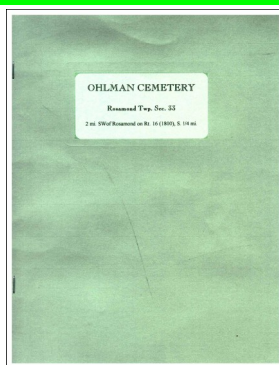
MORRISONVILLE CEMETERY

The cemetery is situated in King Township.

This book contains a brief history and map of the cemetery. The records (1880-1944 at the village hall) were transcribed by Dorothy Bullard—then in 2003 the cemetery was walked & read.

Divided in two sections, this book has separate recordings for the transcribed records and the readings of 2003.

Contains 137 pages of transcriptions / readings.

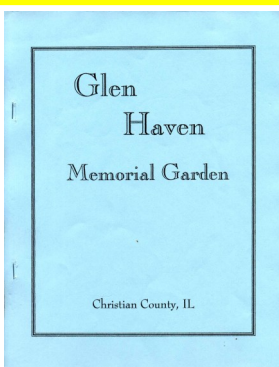


OHLMAN CEMETERY

Contains 15 pages of transcriptions.

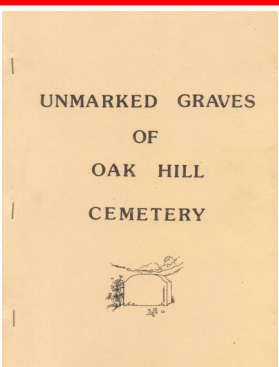


GLEN HAVEN MEMORIAL GARDEN

Located in Taylorville Township this cemetery was organized in the early 1950's.

The transcriptions contained in this book were compiled from the written records of the cemetery in 2003 and the readings taken by R.A. "Curley" Carlock in 1988.

Contains 19 pages of transcriptions.



UNMARKED GRAVES OF OAK HILL CEMETERY

A compilation by R.A. "Curley" Carlock, this book is a comparison of the inscriptions found on the tombstones and later was copied from the cemetery books. Then comparing the two resources, this volume is the result.

Contains 84 pages of 'unmarked' graves.

Results of these book were taken from a DAR state project in early 1960's.

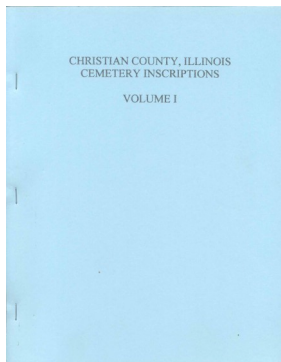
All were read by volunteer readers under the direction of Thelma Gardner.

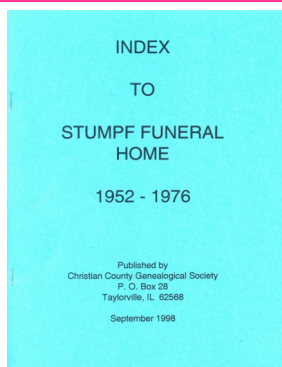

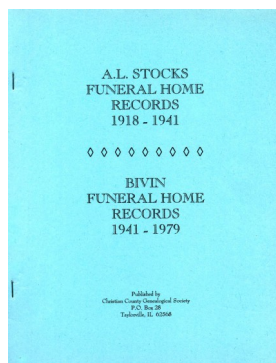


**INDEX TO STUMPF FUNERAL HOME

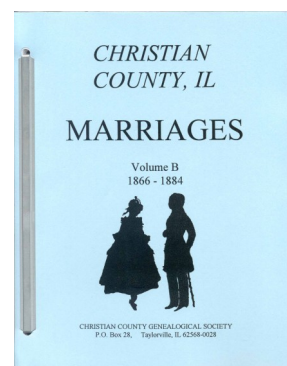

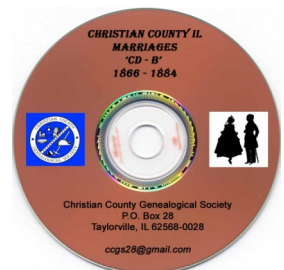

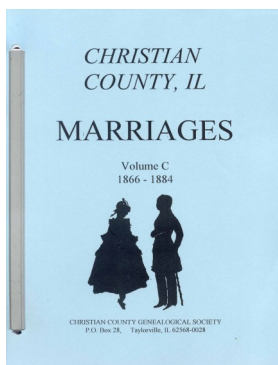

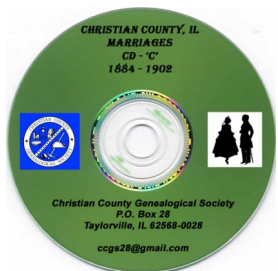

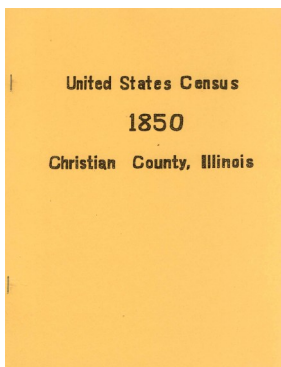




UNITED STATES CENSUS

As with all 1840 U.S. Census it lists only the heads of families. Two columns of enumerations are given here. The Free White Males and Free White Females

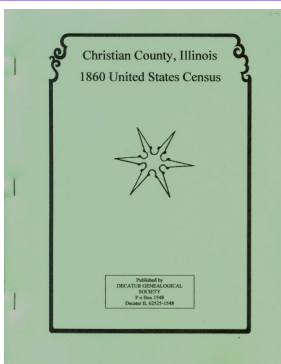

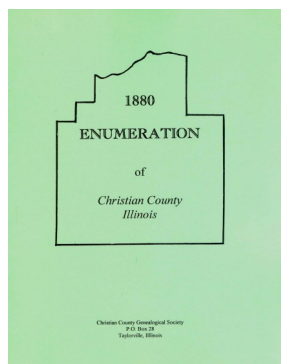

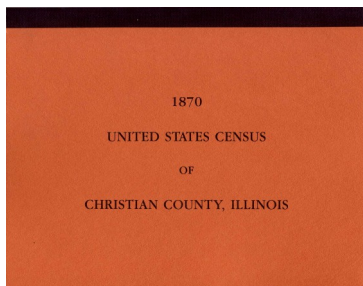

Started by R.A. "Curley" Carlock, this book was finished by Jeanine Biondolino and Joe & Diane Champley.

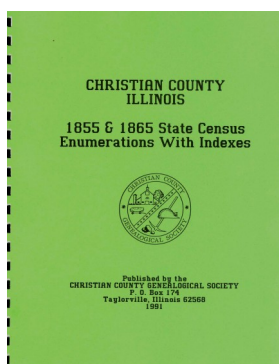


1870 UNITED STATES CENSUS of CHRISTIAN COUNTY., ILLINOIS

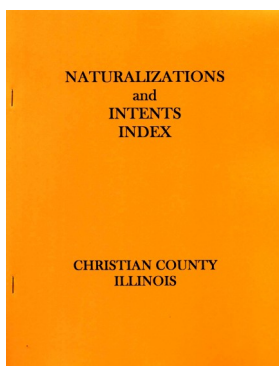
Finished in 1988 by several Christian County members this work will definitely help those doing genealogy research in Christian County.

Transcribed by Carol Gustafson and proofread by volunteers from the Society, published by the Christian County Genealogical Society in 1991.

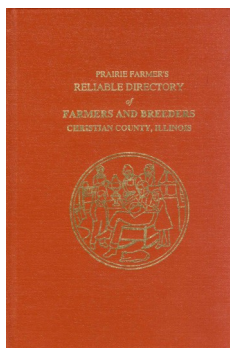


NATURALIZATIONS and INTENTS INDEX Christian County, Illinois

This index was created by CCGS researcher's with Rosella Willingham Brookens, a Christian County Genealogical Researcher in October 1997.

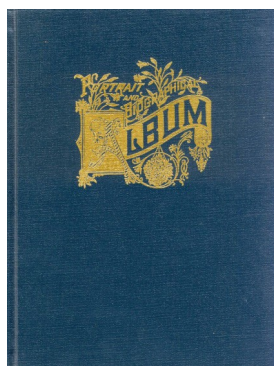

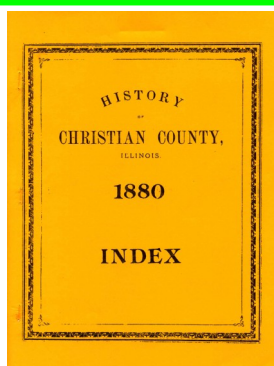


PORTRAIT & BIOGRAPHICAL RECORD

It also includes an 'every name' index for easy look-ups.

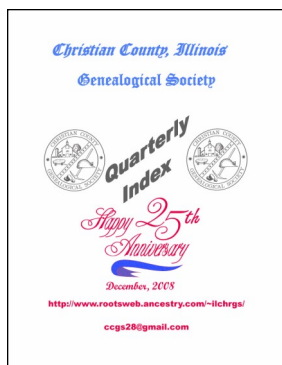

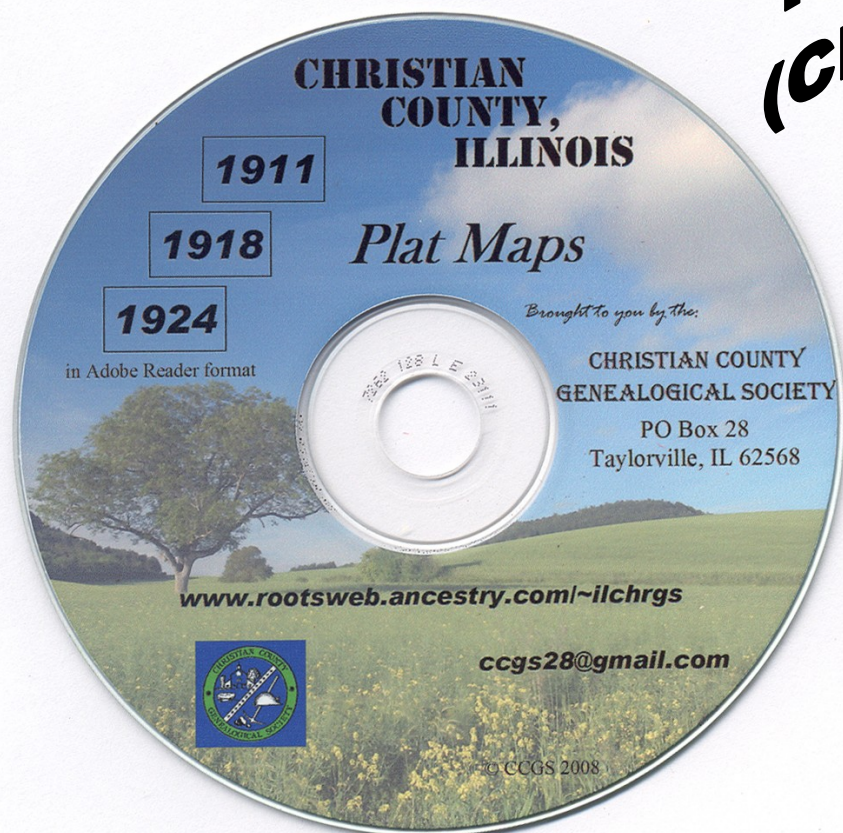

Each comes with a Tutorial — name searchable indexes — a plat of each Christian County Township in each year — color coded years for easy identification.

Both CD's are accessible with the free Adobe Acrobat Reader requiring no other installation.

The 1872 map has a 'name list' that shows the Township / Setion of each property owner — 1891 has a 'Historical directory' listing business, Residence, Post Office, Yr. Birth, Nativity, and when came to County — 1902 also has a name index with Township/ Section shown.

Original ads from various businesses are also shown thru-out.

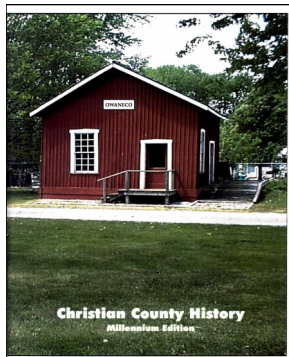
Plat Map CD 2
