According to Gretchen Leisen, many people from the central Minnesota area stem from the province of Luxembourg, Belgium. One of her goals in joining The Belgian Researchers is to learn as much as possible about Belgian research so that in turn she could be of help to people of Belgian descent in her area who are starting their genealogical research. Gretchen's own Belgian ancestors go way back when Varnier Dumont is listed in Munchwies, Saarland, Germany as coming from the "Pays de Liege", he died in Munchwies 3 March 1700, his widow Johanna Jacqueline died there also on 12 Jan. 1719. Barbara Conway VanDePete is still searching for her Van de Putte/Van de Pete ancestors. After the "Genealogical Helper" published her query she received some replies from descendants of various Van de Putte families whose ancestors had emigrated to the U.S. from Belgium. One Van de Putte family emigrated from Deerlijk, WF around 1880 and settled in Seattle; another Van de Putte family emigrated from Berchem, AN in 1921, another one from Ghent, one from Izegem, WF; one from Moerbeke-Waas, EF., one from Eeklo EF emigrated in 1910. The most exciting reply was a note saying that the records went back to Philippe Van de Putte born in Oudensarde, EF, August 26, 1676, enclosing a family coat of arms from a publication dated 1524 in Ghent. In all including her own Van de Putte plus one family from Attre HT, 7 different, but perhaps related Van de Putte families emigrated to the U.S. from Belgium. We received a letter of inquiry from Jean A. Larson, editor of the California Genealogical Society's newsletter, requesting informations about the Walloon emigration to Sweden during the 16-1700's, she explained that her grandmother was a HEDIN and that that name had been changed earlier from HEDMAN, Hedman means Moor or Heathman in Swedish. The earliest Hedman was Olof Jonsson Hedman, born in 1704 in Ockelbo, Gasterikland, Sweden; he was a charcoal maker and later he moved to Jamtland province with a mining boom there. His wife was a daughter of Dragoon Johan Sallman. There is a strong possibility that Olof Hedman and his wife were of Walloon descent and that their ancestors came from Belgium.

#### SEARCHING MICROFILMED REGISTERS OF EAST FLANDERS, BELGIUM

For over five years I have been searching microfilmed Vital Statistics Registers of East Flanders for my Belgian ancestors with good results. These films, made by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, which cover a high percentage of the registers available from the earliest parish registers to the year 1870 of the civil registers provided me with the opportunity to accomplish that which I could not do without lengthy visits to Belgium, a most expensive undertaking.

Recently, I have been mentally reviewing the course of events since the beginning of my search, what I did not know at the start, what I had to learn out of necessity, and the good feeling when I found an important link in my ancestry chain. From this review came the impulse to write about my experiences and observations on the use of these films in the hope that it will be of use to anyone who is in the position what I was in some years ago. I realize that my search has been limited to one Province in the Flemish area but believe that many of the problems encountered will apply to a varying degree in other provinces of Belgium.

The sequence of my education did not necessarily follow in the order in which this paper is written; the order was arranged to present it in a more logical manner.

Preparation for Searching - A prerequisite for any effective search is to know the town or local area from which an ancestor came. Without this information, the search can be quite difficult. In my case, three locations were involved; the first being no problem because it was the birthplace of my father who had told me where he had been born. Determining the other two locations served to emphasize a basic principle in genealogy - do your homework in the United States before attempting to bridge the gap to a foreign country. After much searching, the origin of my maternal grandmother was determined by a "place of birth" entry on a death certificate of one of her sisters. The third location, that of my maternal grandfather, could not be found on any records of him or his relatives. Luckily, one of my cousins, after rummaging through a trunk left by his father, found a small scrap of paper which not only gave the information on my grandfather but also on his brothers and sisters. More than that, it gave him mother's birth date and place together with the names of her parents. A Gold mine on a small scrap of paper.

Search Objectives - The geometrical progression of direct line ancestors dictates that objectives be established for any search. When you consider only eight generations, you are working with up to 255 direct line family group sheets together with all accompanying source material. Pursuing lateral families can raise this figure considerably. The primary objectives I set for myself were to find as many direct line ancestors as I could, male and female, and expand laterally only to their children's births, marriages, and deaths. In other words, fill in all the spaces on a typical family group sheet. Any other lateral expansion would be done only to the extent necessary to accomplish a specific goal or to resolve a puzzling relationship. After I achieve as much of this primary objective as I can, it will then be time to consider new objectives.

Microfilm Card Catalog (MCC) - After the registers of Belgium had been microfilmed, catalog cards were prepared to describe the contents of each film and the cards then microfilmed so that the information

could be made available to the Branch Libraries of the Church. The MCC films for Belgium are numbered 934,403 to 934,410 inclusive. These eight films, which eventually will be replaced by the new Computer Catalog, start with cards that pertain to Belgium in general, then on to cards that pertain to the Provinces. The catalog cards for East Flanders start on film number 934,409 and continue on film 934,410. It is essential that these films be consulted in detail if any effective search is to be conducted. As an example, the information on a catalog card for the town of East Eeklo shows the following:

This example shows that nine films cover the vital statistics registers for East Eeklo from 1680 to 1870. Other towns may have more or fewer rolls of film, depending upon the size of the town and population activity over the years. Ghent, the capitol of East Flanders, required 316 rolls of film for the civil registers from 1796 to 1870. I did not count the number of rolls which cover the parish registers prior to 1796, but it was considerable.

For register films that were cataloged after these MCC films were prepared, the LDS Main Library in Salt Lake City should be queried.

Selection of Films - After gaining an understanding of the MCC films, I copied the information from the cards of the towns of my interest so that their contents could be studied in detail at home. This allowed more time for determining which specific films to order instead of wasting valuable microfilm reader time at the library.

Parish registers are the earliest, generally covering the period from some year in the seventeenth century to about 1796. Some of the registers from the larger and older towns begin in the sixteenth century. Most parish registers are fully indexed by baptisms, marriages and deaths, a factor that aids significantly in search. Civil registers begin about 1796 and have been filmed to 1870. They are indexed at the end of each year and many are indexed by ten year periods. Some ten year indexes are consolidated and may be on the same or a different roll of film than the actual documents to which they relate. In the preceding East Eeklo example, note that the consolidated ten year indexes for marriages during 1796-1870 are at the end of a roll containing birth records, and the consolidated ten year indexes for deaths during that period are at the end of a roll containing marriage records. Consequently, selection of films must be made carefully to assure getting the records which will do you the most good. I found it best when selecting film to order both the indexes and the registers at the same time so that I could work one against the other. Also, in most cases, I found it better to order films for the six month rather than the two week period. The cost is not much greater and good use can be made of the longer time to conduct a more thorough search.

Language Problems - I am not a linguist and because of this had many misgivings prior to attempting the search. The extent of my foreign language knowledge was some basic German learned from one semester at school and service tours of duty in Germany. While this little knowledge helped with the Dutch language, particularly with dates and numbers, I soon discovered that I also was faced with French and Latin. All I can say is - do not despair. Although the registers are not completely formatted, a pattern is discernable in most of them. With the help of published dictionaries for the three languages, together with a multi-dictionary for each language made up of the most frequently used words, I was amazed at how much of the documents I could translate after a little experience. For those documents containing information which seemed important but I could not translate completely, I always managed to find someone who could do it for me. As for mini-dictionaries; dates, numbers and the most frequently used words sufficient for the initial translation attempt at the library, after which copied the document as best possible so that I could expand the translation at home with the use of a regular dictionary. A good start for your own dictionary is the multi-language mini-dictionary found in Belgian Laces #14 dated May 1980; however, I found that I could work better with separate mini-dictionaries for each language. Reading dates is not too difficult but I still have trouble distinguishing between some of the cardinal and ordinal numbers. Months are readily recognizable except for the Dutch Oogst and French Aout for August. In heavy use were the designations 7bre, 9bre and 10bre which stand for September, October, November and December respectively. To me, the greatest problem was not the translation but being able to read the handwriting used over the years, particularly that found in the early Parish Registers.

French Republican Calendar - Anyone who works with registers during the period 1793 to 1805 will encounter the use of the French Republican Calendar and probably will be as completely baffled as I was. When first seen I knew it had to be a date, but had no idea of how I could convert it to our Gregorian Calendar. Encyclopedias, an old book on the French Revolution, and Belgian Laces (newsletter) #6 of May 1978 provided broad information about the Calendar, but each description raised further questions. For example, I found several charts which, by the use of simple arithmetic for the conversion of day, coupled with an equating of months and years, provided an approximate converted date; however, the charts did not take leap years into account which is necessary if accurate conversion is desired. The Gregorian years 1796 and 1804 were leap years (1800 was not a leap year), but the French Republican leap years were III (1794-1795), VII (1798-1799) and XI (1801-1802). Consequently, no simple chart can provide for true conversion of dates without complicated footnotes. The chart in the Belgian Laces Newsletter will serve to convert a date from the French Republican Calendar to the Gregorian Calendar and will be accurate to within two days. For greater accuracy, I compiled a separate chart for each French Republican year from its inception date of 22 September 1792 to its demise on 31 December 1805.

Reading of Parish Registers - Aside from the usual and expected problems in reading Parish Registers, there are some details about the registers of this Province that should be specifically mentioned. The Catholic Parish Registers, which were written in Latin, generally are quite stylized and can be read after a little practice. The main problem is the handwriting. Fortunately, most of these registers are indexed in a more readable handwriting which allows for a comparison

of names and helps in the reading of the registers. This cross-play of names between the indexes and the registers is invaluable and one of the principal reasons why I suggest having both films on hand when working. Children were registered by the dates of their baptisms which may or may not be the dates of their births. Occasionally, a birth date is also given; however, I noticed that most baptisms occurred the same or succeeding day of the birth so if a birth date is not given, you most likely will not be far off.

When first working with a specific roll of film containing parish registers, take the time to review the order of the entries because frequently they are not in strict chronological order nor separated into neat sections of baptisms, marriages and deaths. The order of entries on the film for East Eeklo, 1650-1796 are: (B=Baptisms; M=Marriages; D=Deaths) D1777-1779; B 1680-1712; B 1734-1740; M1681-1711; M 1734-1740; D 1682-1710; D 1734-1740; 1st Communion 1777-1782; B 1714-1736; M 1714-1734; D 1731-1736; D 1741-1776; B 1780-1795; M 1780-1795. Finding a specific entry without a listing to work from even with index information, would be frustrating and time consuming. The 30 minutes to one hour necessary to review a film can save you many hours of searching later.

The indexes of the Catholic Parish Registers apparently were compiled by each town and vary in content and arrangement. For example, the index to the Parish Registers of Baptisms in East Eeklo is in alphabetical order by the family name and gives the first name of the child, name of the father, full maiden name of the mother, date of the baptism and the page number of the register. Such an index simplifies the grouping of families. Baptism indexes of parish registers in some other towns do not give the parents' names, which means that the actual baptism entries for appropriate time periods must be read. Indexes to marriages prepared by each town generally contain the same information but some towns compiled one alphabetical index for all names while other towns compiled two indexes, one for the grooms and one for the brides. Indexes to deaths were prepared alphabetically with wives and widows generally listed by their maiden names. Occasionally they are listed twice, once by their maiden name and once by their married name. When the death register contains the name of the spouse, that fact usually is included in the index. On the occasions when a name, but no date of death is given, check for other spellings of the name. One especially helpful factor that can be obtained from the indexes is variations in the spelling of names. Remember, the priests who made the entries in the parish registers wrote the names as they heard them, a fact which was reflected in the spelling. Consider and check all possible variations of spelling. As one example, the baptisms of the children of Petrus LACAYSE and Anna VANOVERVELT, the names were spelled: LACAGIE, LACAYSE, LACAYSE, LACASE and LACAYSE.

Reading of Civil Registers - Civil registers started about 1796 and have been filled up to about 1870. From about 1796 to about 1814 the registers were written in French and thereafter in Dutch. In all cases, genealogical information contained in these registers is outstanding. Aside from one short period in the very early 1800s, when the French tried to institute printed forms with spaces for filling in of information, the registers were written free style. Birth entries, in addition to the parents' names, usually give the parents' ages or dates of birth and where they were born. Marriage entries not only give complete name, age or date of birth, and birthplace of the bride and groom, but include the full names of both parents of each as well as their age or date of birth and where they were born. If any of the parents were deceased, that fact is also given, many times with the date and place of death. In some instances, these

Registers also include some information on grandparents. Death entries usually include age or date of birth of the deceased, parents' names with their ages, or if deceased, when and where, as well as information on any spouse of the deceased. In all entries, informants or witnesses must be checked carefully for relatives.

as with parish registers; however, most of the entries are indexed by ten year periods and all of the registers have an index at the end of each year.

Recording of Search Results - It was not long after I started my search before it became apparent that some standardized system of recording the results had to be determined. Information relating directly to a family group sheet could be entered but what about other information that may be related. For example, when working with an index that covers about 150 years of parish registers from a particular town, the information of immediate concern can be extracted but what about other data on that surname which chronologically precedes or follows. The possibilities are high that other entries will pertain to you but the connection cannot be immediately determined. Repeated referrals

to the film are possible but time consuming and, if the film has been returned to the Main Library, costly. Further, how can you trace a person who was born in one town but married in another? A consolidated file of some kind is needed that could help in the grouping of families and tracing the movements of people. How could I bring names together, regardless of spelling or geographical location, but within an acceptable time frame, into one master file? Two methods were considered, a card file and loose leaf notebooks. After weighing the advantages and disadvantages of each, I decided on the notebooks for one primary reason - ease in handling when the file is used later as a searching tool. My notebook master file, presently consisting of ten notebooks, is basically divided by surname, with each surname subdivided into birth, marriage and death sections. Each section is further subdivided into ten-year periods. Thus, a page in one of the notebooks is headed: DE ROO, Marriages, 1810-1819. As I searched and copied information, it was ultimately entered in the Master File, whether or not it could be determined at that time that the information pertained to my ancestry line. In fact, there were many times when I copied complete index information on a specific surname, regardless of spelling, simply because I could not immediately determine who were related to my line. As a consequence, the file developed to the point where I could look at a page (or pages) and see all individuals of one surname who were born within a ten year period no matter how their names were spelled nor in what town they were born. One instance in which this file helped was when I found the birth of nine children of a direct line family but could not find the marriage of the parents. As my entries in the file grew, the births of more children were noted at earlier times in another town not far away which in turn led me to the marriage. The larger the file becomes, the greater I find its value as a search tool.

**Summary** - Searching microfilmed registers can be most rewarding. All it takes is patience, close attention to all information found in these documents, and time.
