He was married to Appolonia Barbara GHESQUIERRE, daughter of Petrus Jacobus and Regina Constancia DEBERGH, born in Langemark, WF on 11 Nov. 1817, she died Langemark on 27 Oct. 1888
 Their children : Julianus VERSCHOOT, born Langemark June 14, 1851 - Carolus Ludovicus VERSCHOOT (direct ancestor of Charlyne and Yolanda) born Langemark on 20 July 1853, married Philomena FLYPS 21 May 1879, he died in Loker 16 Oct. 1928 - Leonia VERSCHOOT, born Langemark 1 January 1857 married Jean SOENEN.

Leo GAUTHIER 1 Sept. 1917, died Norwich, Ontario January 9, 1966 - Mary Edwardina VERSCHOOT b. Winnipeg in 1892 married Alphonse SALAMONE died 1955 - William Titus VERSCHOOT b. 20 July 1894 Winnipeg, married Amy TAYLOR died 4 Nov. 1965 - Alphonsine Juliana VERSCHOOT (mother of Charlyne) b. Winnipeg 16 Dec. 1897 m. William SCHADEK 17 Nov. 1919, died 30 June 1971.

Along with this information, Yolanda NORTON, 69 Hampshire Drive, Troy, Michigan, sent an interesting article about her grandmother's sister, Juliana FLYPS, who married a nobleman, Arthur MERGHELYNCK, 13 years her senior, on 20 June 1895 in Beauvoorde. Arthur passed away in 1908, Juliana mourned him for the rest of her life (she died in 1941), she was known as the "Black Lady" because from the day Arthur died she always wore black, she stayed in the bottom rooms of the castle, during the last three years of her life she never left these rooms. Pictures of "Beauvoorde" her castle and of her wedding (she was very pretty) were enclosed but we cannot reproduce them here.

for those doing research in the pre-1795 church records in regard to names: very often people by the name of Albert or Hubert or Norbert were called "BERTEN" which can also be an abbreviation for Bertelomeus. So if a father or a witness identified himself to the priest as "BERTEN" it's possible that the scribe ignoring the name, guessed it to be "Albert" or "Hubert" or "Bertelomeus". Perhaps in one record that person will be identified as "Albert" and in another one as "Bertelomeus".
 Now about the Latin name JUDOCUS, can it be translated as JOSSE or JUDE in French, and JOOST or JUDAS in Flemish ? It's so happens that JOSSE and JUDE and JOOST and JUDAS can be the correct translations of JUDOCUS which is a name of Celtic origin - (In Brittany, St. Josse-sur-Mer owes its name to St. Jodoc son of Judicael). In English the correct translation could be either Jude or Joyce.

More about names, found by Sandra DOBBIE, 15, Ballymena Court, Don Mills, North York, Ontario, M3C 2B8 Canada, in "Newsleaf" Volume XIV, Number 1, March 1984, published by Ontario Genealogical Society: BUFFALOES - Few people today with exception of the "Buffaloes" themselves realize that at one time this was the nickname for a whole wave of immigrants during the 1920's and the 1930's; the Flemish people. According to stories the name was actually adopted from the city of Buffalo. Many young men, who were the first immigrants came across the Atlantic working their passage on cattle boats or other freight ships. Feeling the lure of the New Land, America, whose reputation sometimes reached fabled proportions in the "old

country, they landed ship in Buffalo, N.Y. Hence, the name Buffalo stuck even if the somewhat unusual immigration technique was shortlived in popularity.

St. James Cathedral in Toronto - Church of England. (Anglican)

Toronto began in 1793 as the Town of York. St. James was the first church, begun 1803, opened 1807. The city of Toronto was incorporated in 1834 and is currently celebrating its Sesqui-Centennial. Until @ 1830, the church of England was the only church permitted to perform marriages. They never became the Established Church as in England, although they fought hard for it, and often acted as though they were a State church. The Ontario Genealogical Society, Toronto Branch is copying the St. James registers and compiling an index, Sandra DOBBIE is helping by doing some proof-reading, in the baptism records she came across the following reference to Brussels:

Charles PARKER, born 6 feb. 1822, Richard Hyde PARKER, born 8 Nov. 1823, Frederick PARKER, born 6 Sept. 1825, children of James and Maria PARKER, baptized 3 Oct. 1828 at St. James by Thos. PHILLIPS - Copy of a certificate in the hands of James and Maria PARKER: "Brussels May 19, 1816, George Stephen ord. (??) son of James and Maria PARKER, wine merchant, was baptized this 19th day of May by me Edward MILLER, A.M., officiating minister" This is a true copy, Thos. PHILLIPS, Oct. 3, 1828

Toronto Library is full of surprises like the Flemish speaking librarian who helped Sandra with some translation. This young librarian was born in the Dutch East Indies, where her family was for several generations - she is searching for the ancestors of Melanie VAN MALDEGEM who married Paul Alexander KOUTHOUFD (he died in 1904)

Last winter when we were all freezing to death, who was in Belgium having a good time? Pierre INGHELIS! (Fruitdale Rt. 3, Box 3161, LaGrande, Oregon 97850) who spent a few weeks there, visiting relatives and showing off his grandson.

Another lucky fellow wrote: "I have just returned from Belgium last Thursday (June 7) after spending 10 days there and seeing much of rural Brabant, including the village of Grez-Doiceau. I didn't get to do much research for time didn't permit it. My uncle and aunt travelled with me, both speak the Walloon language with no difficulties and we were warmly greeted by everyone we met. The trip was very nice, we lived with the family MERTENS of Villeroux, BT. I also visited the birthplace of my grandfather and visited with a family in St. Joris-Weert, also by the name of MERTENS... I didn't do much research but I did return with three books filled with photos of Belgium."

We wish to thank Marie MOORE, Box 25365, Ft. Lauderdale, Fl., 33320, for sending a copy of the IPPERSIEL/YPPERSIEL pedigree chart, (Meux family). She would like to know if anyone has informations about the descendants of the AMPHION family who emigrated to Melville, LA. in 1880 with her ancestors, the HAIBES from St. Denis. NR. The HAIBES emigrated to Melville, Louisiana because they had learned that it was a good place to grow sugar cane. The HAIBES grew sugar beets in St. Denis and after several years of crop failure they decided to come to America.

Marie doesn't know if she has relatives in Wisconsin, like the DELWICHE name found in her pedigree chart would let us to believe, she does have a picture taken in Green Bay, of an unknown person, she is trying to have it identified. (Since her DELWICHES were from St. Denis, in an effort to find the place of origin of Eugene DELWICHE, we have written to St. Denis/

La Bruyère townhall, requesting that they kindly let us know if that Wisconsin emigrant was from that region)

Evelynn SANTILLI, 31480 Hilltop Rd., Golden, Colorado 80403 is coming along fine with her research, we wish to thank her for the many photocopies she sent of Langemark church record indexes and also for the research she is doing trying to find the whereabouts of Henry BOUTTE (unpublished query).

We are not bragging, our members are most generous when it comes to do research for others, giving copies of materials and all around help. We received from Charlotte ROGERS, 303 Reed St., Jeannette, Pa. 15644, photocopies of historical background on some towns of Brabant. We will start publishing this very soon. We want to be the first ones to wish Charlotte, her daughter and her 2 sisters the very best for their upcoming trip to Belgium. Charlotte reports that a Mrs. Taylor from California, another descendant of Desire CORNET will be in Belgium in September, this lady sent a picture of her grandfather Desire CORNET and his family, 7 men (one holding a pigeon), 11 women and 21 children are on that picture, no date is given but there is a strong possibility that it was taken in Belgium prior to his emigration in 1889. There is an older woman in the middle of everybody, maybe she is Charlotte's great-grandmother.

A photograph/postcard of a couple was sent to Charlotte's grandmother in 1913 from Salem, W.V., the note written in the back, read that they wish their brother and sister a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year, it was signed "Gustin" Cornet - and it was assumed that it was the man's name. But from the information given by Joan SIEGERT and published in BL # 30, Charlotte was able to identify the lady on the postcard as Augustine CORNET, her grandmother's sister who had also emigrated to the U.S. from Bonlez. The man on the picture hasn't been identified so far.

We are still searching for the descendants of Leon BAUDOUX and his wife Josephine DANDROY, they emigrated with 3 children (Leona, Leon and Sylvain) in 1889 from Jumet, Belgium - Charlotte found a Baudoux family in Pennsylvania, and their relatives in Michigan (also contacted by Irene VERNIER) but they are not descendants of Leon BAUDOUX, neither are the Indiana BAUDOUXs, nor the Kentucky BAUDOUXs.

Mr. Jean STAUMONT-DANDROY, on behalf of whom this research has been conducted, told a very interesting story about a Marguerite BAUDOUX, direct ancestor of his wife, who was born in Gosselies, HT, in 1795, she devoted herself in helping the sick people during an epidemic, and up to 1947, her descendants were known by the nickname "Marguerite". From a recent letter from Mr. STAUMONT, we learned that the Leon BAUDOUX family was living in Rich Hill "America", so far we have identified 4 Rich Hill, one in Bates Co., Mo. (family), one in Muskingum Co., Ohio, one in Knox Co., Ohio, and one in Greene Co. Pa. Only time and research will tell which one is the right one.

And what is happening to our good friend
 Father Jean DUCAT ? A lot !!! During his
 pleasant trip to Louisiana, he visited
 with two World War II veterans; one,
 Mr. Earl Willis, mayor of St. Martinville,
 was with the 116th Regiment, 29th Division
 who liberated Charlevoix on 4 Sept. 1944.
 The other one, Mr. JUNI, also from St.
 Martinville, showed him a faded yellow
 star bearing a single word "Bastogne"
 - a remainder of the Battle of the Bulge
 where he fought. In the same town, Father
 DUCAT saw the grave of a much beloved
 Belgian citizen, Father Joseph PEETERS,
 born in Meerhout, Belgium, who was
 St. Martinville parish priest from 1917
 to 1941. References to two other Belgians
 were also found: 1) Frederic ANDREOLE from
 Brabant - he was 35 in 1794 when stationed
 as a soldier at Attakapas Fort (now St.
 Martinville). 2) Charles GREVENBERG, sugar
 cane plantation owner, son of Francois
 and Euphrosine BOISDORRE, he settled on
 Bayou Teche in Alabama Plantation, he
 died in 1851.

Now a word about MacDonald, Pennsylvania!
 It seems that the French Church of MacDonald
 was built in 1904 by a group of French
 speaking Belgian Protestants who had
 emigrated there - recently acquired stained
 glass windows mention the Belgian immigration
 from Jumet and Courcelles. Names found in
 the MacDonald area: MASQUELLIER, DEHOUX,
 DESEUTER, CHARLIER, LAGNEAU, CARBONNIER,
 SUPLET, BROWET, LEONARD, etc...
 Two famous glass manufacturers, QUERTINMONT
 and BASTIN were born in Jumet, Belgium.

Now, Father DUCAT contacted one of his
 former student, Roland SCHAFER (who
 turned out to be related to Aureore SCHIAFF
 who told him a most interesting story.
 In 1930, Nov. 16th., died without leaving
 a will, the very rich Henrietta GARET,
 daughter of Christoph SCHAEFER of
 Philadelphia, she had no close relatives,
 yet, 10,000 persons claimed to be her
 heirs... this went on until 1951.
 John HIERSOUX, glass maker from Charlesto
 W.V., whose mother was a SCHAFER from
 Jumet/Roux, urged his American and
 Belgians SCHAFER relatives to made known
 their rights to the inheritance of
 Henrietta SCHAEFER GARET, this led to
 much genealogical research that shows
 that Aureore SCHAFER's ancestors came from
 Erdd, Hesse, Germany - Johan Christof
 SCHAFER b. 1707, father of Johan Georg
 born 1738, father of Conrad born 1782.
 It is known that around 1802-1803, Conrar
 SCHAFER was a mercenary soldier, he
 was at Waterloo in 1815, probably
 with an English Regiment. He had
 a son Jean, born in Jumet where he
 he had somewhat settled. Jean
 SCHAFER had 7 children, including
 Felicien SCHAFER, Aureore's
 grandfather.

I believe I earlier shared with you the proposal made to the federal government to establish a garden built of soils from all nations of the earth contributing immigrants to America. The idea has been agreed to. A site has been chosen on Ellis Island, and announcement should come sometime in July.

The seed of the proposal was the inclusion of Belgian soil beneath the Walloon Memorial in Battery Park (Manhattan) at its dedication in 1924. Thus, the sentiments of the Belgian people expressed in that action is the genesis of what will become a well-known portion of the Statue of Liberty/Ellis Island Monument. Isn't that grand?

Enclosed is a copy of a letter to federal authorities on the subject. I earlier provided them with much material relating to the 1924 tercentennial celebration of the Walloon landing, including the placing of a basket of soil beneath the memorial.

When the Statue of Liberty/Ellis Island Monument comprehensive development plan is made public later this summer, you might want to bring it to the attention of your associates in Belgium. It would offer opportunity for an interesting feature in the Belgian press.

The earliest DETRO ancestor found so far was in fact named "DELBROUCK" (brouck is a germanic word meaning marsh) "Piron DELBROUCK DE TRO" de Xendremael, born ca. 1450, appears to have held a certain rank in life, he was alderman of Xhendremael and mayor of Villers St. Simeon/Juprelle, many of his descendants intermarried with notable families of the region. The sources of information identifying Piron DE TRO are: surveyor records, account records, court of justice records. He had 4 sons: Gilet DE TROU, Piron DE TROU alias TROKA, Collar DE TRO and Willene DE TROU.

Because of the knowledge and resourcefulness of Jacques DETRO, there is a distinct advantage in having ancestors in the Liege area--countless times he has helped countless people. Definitely, he has a special "knack" to find out of the ordinary records, like those presumed lost of the "reliefs des metiers". But the following reveals a most unusual situation.

Yes, you are seeing right, Jean ROSSAY married his mother's half sister who was just three years older than he!

We regret to report the death of Mr. Georges SCHWEITZER, genealogist of Toernich (near Arlon), Belgium. Mr. SCHWEITZER passed away on May 25, 1984 in Toernich. He was born in Heinsch, Lx., on Feb. 26, 1906; in 1928 he left Belgium for the Belgian Congo (now Zaire) where he spent 37 years working as a surveyor for the "Union Miniere" in Katanga Province. He was married to the former Marie SIMON of Diekirch, Grand-Duchy, they had four children.

In 1965, after settling back in the Schweitzer ancestral home in Toernich, he started to work on his genealogy, searching for informations in the various archives repositories. The Arlon region is perhaps the hardest to do research in, and from generations to come, genealogists and historians alike will benefit from his work. We wish to thank his daughter, Mrs. Marinette DEMARLIER-SCHWEITZER for forwarding to The Belgian Researchers, the "Familles du Pays d'Arlon" a 76 pp. genealogy (EISCHEN and allied families) that her father was planning to send us. Little by little we will translate and publish it.

Remember a while back, our query about a Belgian emigrant " Martin GYRE/GYRE" ? we found one in the AIS, listed in the Clay Township, Indiana 1850 Federal census. Our ever obliging Dan RENTMEESTERS investigated the matter and found that this Martin GYRE came from Virginia and not from Belgium. Going the extra mile, Dan talked to a person by the name of GYR who told him that he originated from Tell City, Indiana and that his ancestors came from Switzerland.
