Dorothy's maternal grandfather, Camiel LYBERT, was born in Vinkt,EF, on 13 Feb.1861, he married Leona VERBRUGGE in Belgium, where their first child was also born - the exact place of marriage is not known, nor is the birthplace of Leona VERBRUGGE, perhaps it's Waterland-Oudemans or Aalter. Around 1886 the LYBERT/VERBRUGGE couple emigrated to Iowa where they lived for several years, then they moved to Northern Wisconsin where they bought a farm and lived the remainder of their lives. Leona had a sister Louise who lived at Jackson, Minn. and a brother Ivo who lived in East Moline, Ill. A niece of Camiel LYBERT (also spelled LYBAERT) lived also in the Moline Ill. area Dorothy MAYOU HARTLEY, 17405 S. Woodland Rd., Shaker Heights, Ohio 44120, would like to correspond with anyone researching the LYBERT-VERBRUGGE surnames.

Father Jean DUCAT was overjoyed to have found his American cousins (with great help from Denise CORKE) but so was Phyllis DUCAT STEWART, RR. 1, Box 130, Clifton, Ill. 60927, whose first love is also genealogy, a few years ago, she started a DUCAT family book, which her son calls her "Great Book", raising 4 children and working 45 hrs. a week doesn't leave much time to do research, however Phyllis has managed very well and is most thankful for all the informations that she received from Father DUCAT, it shows that the first known DUCAT ancestor was Sebastien DUCAT, born 1700 in Glimes, BT, he married Marie Josephe PETINIOT, they had 10 children. Her emigrant ancestors were Francois Joseph DUCAT, son of Louis DUCAT and Marie Louise GABRIEL, he married Anne Josephe DUCAT on 1 Aug. 1852. They came to the U.S. in 1856 or 1856 and settled in Clifton, Ill.

Katherine LAVERNE PICARD found out about our organization thru Marlen WHITTHAIR. Katherine's grandmother was Marie Esther BRUTOUT born in Charleroi HT, on 12 Sept. 1869. David KILLEN's 220 N.W. 53rd Terrace, Gladstone, MO., 64118) Belgian ancestors were Paul MASSUY, born 3 Sept. 1801 in Wasseiges, LG and Marie Joseph DUEROI born 3 March 1805 in Hemptinne, NR., their children, Marie Therese, Virginie, Benjamin Victor and Maximilien Joseph were all born in Wasseiges, LG. The MASSUY family departed from Antwerp on 23 March 1856, arriving in New York on 15 May 1856. In one of the Passenger Lists copied by Clement DEROO and published in Belgian Laces # 25, p. 17, Father DUCAT found the MASSUY family listed on the ship "MATILDA". Many families listed on the ship settled in Illinois and in Wisconsin.

Our friend, Roger PAEPS, Hollestraat 26, 3050, St. Joris-Weert, Belgium, is now a member of our organization, in the past, he has been most helpful to our members, so it was with pleasure that we forwarded to him the GRAHAM POLLY passenger list (found by Daniel RENTMEESTERS) and the SWITZERLAND passenger list (found by Howard THOMAS) that he requested. MY TRIP TO BELGIUM

We arrived at Namur, on Saturday October 13th (1984) and stayed at the Hotel Queen Victoria. This is a small hotel with 20 rooms, excellent food and the best coffee I've ever tasted.

Father DUCAT and Marie Elise ANRIJS, his interpreter, came to the hotel, at 6:30 Sunday morning. Father was waving a small American flag, so we would know him. He called us Saturday night, to welcome us to Belgium. When he heard there were four of us, he called our 3rd cousin, Gustave CORNET of Haine St. Paul, to drive also. We were looking forward to meeting Gustave, our new found cousin in Belgium. My sister Bernice SEITER, of North Little Rock, Arkansas, and myself went with Father DUCAT, while Marie Elise waited with my sister Mercedes REGOLA, of Greensburg, Pa., and my daughter Judy for Gustave, he was late because of the dense fog. We first drove to Chaumont-Gistoux, one of my ancestral villages, and saw the Church and the cemetery. We could not stay long, we were due at Bonlez for 10A.M. Mass. When we arrived at Bonlez, Father GETTEMANS was waiting for us and

led us up to the front of the church. Father DUCAT assisted at Mass and it was very beautiful. The singing was like a large choir, it was so lovely I choked up. The Church was very old and I felt as if my ancestors were welcoming me to their Church. During Mass a parishioner spoke from the altar, he welcomed me to Bonlez, the village of my ancestors and wish me health. What else he said, I don't know, I was so overwhelmed.

Father DUCAT had spoken to Father GETTEMANS about our visit and Father GETTEMANS put an article in the area paper, stating that anyone wishing to meet us was to come to Mass and the reception after Mass in the parish house. It was so nice of Father GETTEMANS to hold a reception for us and it was very exciting to meet our new cousins. Mr. and Mrs. Antoine CORNET from Brussels were there, he told me that he had relatives in Wisconsin. Also there were Fernade CORNET from Chaumont-Gistoux, Isabelle DANDOIT CHAIDRON and her husband Robert, from Grez-Doiceau and Jeanne LAURENT from Bonlez. It turns out I'm related to the CORNETS. Isabelle DANDOIT CHAIDRON told me the picture of my great grand-mother looked exactly like a DANDOIT and looked like her ancestor.

I was surprised when I met Jeanne LAURENT, the resemblance between us was startling. I have traced some of my ancestors in this small village, back to 1702, so I know our lines cross somewhere. I never knew who I looked like, now I know I look like a distant Belgian ancestor. I wanted to attend Mass at Bonlez because this was the first town I had found as the home of my ancestors and the first town I researched through the L.D.S. (Mormons) microfilms. I could have attended Mass at Charleroi, the birthplace of my grandmother Gustavine BRASSEUR, but I felt very strongly that I wanted to visit Bonlez, the birthplace of my great-grandmother, Hortense CORNET. I was not disappointed, the people gave us a warm welcome and I felt as if I belonged to the village.

From Bonlez we went to Grez-Doiceau and saw the church where many of my ancestors were baptized. The University of Wisconsin/Green Bay and the University of Louvain-la-Neuve are doing a combined

research on the emigrants of Grez-Doiceau. Father DUCAT is the leader for the University of Louvain-la-Neuve. We went to the University of Louvain-la-Neuve for dinner. This is a new university, with many buildings and a town growing up around it. As usual the food was excellent. Belgian food is the best! After dinner we drove through Limal Loupaigne and Baisy-Thy. I hope to go back some day to walk the street my ancestors walked. We then went to Charleroi, to the Museum of Glass. Father DUCAT is the President of the Societe Royale d'Archeologie et de Paleontologie et d'Histoire de Charleroi. It was a lovely museum and we wished we had more time to spend there. Father DUCAT presented me with a certificate naming me a Presidente d'Honneur and Animatrice de Memoire Carolo-Brabanconne. This now hangs in my office, I am very proud of it. Mr. and Mrs. STAUMONT-DANDROY were waiting for us at the museum but we were unable to spend any time with them and I felt very badly about that. Father DUCAT then took us to the street where my grandmother was born and the church where she was baptized. Father gave us all a copy of her birth certificate. Father DUCAT is a wonderful person and we enjoyed our visit with him immensely. He had planned our day and it was far more than I had imagined it would be. Marie Elise was a treasure, she was such a help to all of us. We couldn't have managed without her. After Father and Marie Elise said goodbye, we went with our cousin Gustave to Haine St. Paul. We met his wonderful family and had a super visit the food was excellent as usual. Gustave CORNET is doing research on the descendants of Jean Francois CORNET and Henrietta DANDROY. He has a large three ring binder filled with CORNETS, I have many cousins in Belgium. The CORNETS were warm and gracious people, as were all the Belgians I met. I will never forget my trip to Belgium and hope to go back someday.

Also in Leyden were Puritans of England who had chosen voluntary exile. Many of the Puritans of Leyden became the Pilgrims who landed at Plymouth Rock. Many of the Walloons of Leyden became the first permanent settlers of New Amsterdam -- and among the thirty families on the Nieu Nederland Ship landing on Manhattan Island in May 1624 was that of Philippe DU TRIEUX (Craig's ancestor). It is worthy to note that the Pilgrims of the Mayflower were not all of English stock. Among them was Huguenot William MOLINES, listed by the English as "MULLINS". His daughter was Priscilla. Her wedding to John ALDEN was to become a part of American literature through the work of poet LONGFELLOW. " Craig TRUAX, P.O. Box 230, House of Representatives, Main Capitol Building, Harrisburg, Pa. 17120. It is well known that the Walloon living in the Netherlands presented in 1621 a petition (called the Round Robin) to the King of England, requesting permission to settle in Virginia.  to do research in, we don't know how Ruth
 SCHIELTZ, 11820 Reed Rd., Versailles, Ohio
 45380, does it, but here are some

On Feb. 2, 1681, Bernard WAGNER son of Bernard
 WAGNER from Turpange, LX, married Madeleine
 GROS, daughter of Jean GROS from Bebange, LX.
 A 1744 listing shows only a Bernard WAGNER,

There was also another Jean WAGNER living at
 the same time, his ancestors are not known, he

 MENDELS from Messancy.

The ancestors of Pierre WAGNER are not known, he

 Catherine KARIGER, they lived at the house named
 "Michels", they emigrated to America.
- 2) Jean WAGNER who married Jan. 2, 1810, Anne
 Marie NIEDERKORN, sister of the one above, they
 lived in the house named Schmisden.
- 3) Suzanne WAGNER, born on July 4, 1795, married
 to Pierre REUTER, son of Michel and Catherine
 SCHUMACKER.

The couple Jean WAGNER and Barbe TIBESAR lived
 in the house named Jungeltckes, they had:

- 1) Jean WAGNER who married on Feb. 23, 1808
 Marguerite SCHWEICH, daughter of Michel SCHWEICH
 she died and Jean WAGNER married Suzanne GUELF.
 This couple had 2 sons, both named Jean, one
 nicknamed Jenni, gave the name Jennes to the
 house that he bought and where he lived with his
 wife Marguerite NIEDERKORN.
 The other Jean WAGNER lived in the house of his
 father which faced the house named "Hildebrand"
 He was born Oct. 23, 1813 and married Feb. 7, 1838
 Catherine SCHUMACHER, daughter of Philippe and
 Elisabeth GANGLER, she died Aug. 21, 1841 at the
 age of 24, leaving a daughter, Anna WAGNER born
 Jan. 28, 1839. This Jean WAGNER married 2)
 Marie STOFFEL from Aix-sur-Clois, she died May
 8, 1870 at the age of 56. Jean died Oct. 6, 1887.
 The WAGNER/STOFFEL couple had a few children:

The WAGNERS from the house "Gonzen" and also
 the house "Hommels" were related to the
 SCHUMACHERS and the NIEDERKORN families.

We do not know they are related to the first
 WAGNERS mentioned.

Michel WAGNER and his wife Marguerite Suzanne
 FABER had: 1) Michel WAGNER who died July 27, 1869,
 he was married Oct. 27, 1833 to Marie
 Josephine SCHUMACHER, daughter of the
 SCHUMACHER-REITER, born Feb. 20, 1801
 2) Nicolas WAGNER, born June 2, 1798,
 married 23 Feb. 1819 Marie HEYMANS
 daughter of Michel and Catherine
 KRIER from Frassem. They bought the
 Hommels house. Nicolas died Nov. 29, 1861,
 Marie April 12, 1866.
 They had among others one son who married
 in Battincourt and one daughter who
 married in Paris. Then:
 a) Marguerite WAGNER, born Nov. 26,
 1841, married May 13, 1865, to her
 first cousin Jacques WAGNER, son of
 Michel and M.J. SCHUMACHER, born Jan.
 13, 1842. Marguerite died Nov. 18,
 1898 at the age of 57. This couple had
 aa) Michel who married Feb. 21, 1900
 Nathalie DIDIER, he died Aug. 26, 1900

29 Nov. 1785, a marriage contract was signed by
 Nicolas KARIGER from Weyler (witnessed by his
 brother-in-law, Jean HAAS from Weyler, and his
 uncle Antoine WEICKERT from Stockem) and by
 Catherine KARIGER from Bebange, daughter of
 Guillaume and Madeleine SCHOLER (her witnesses
 were her uncle Jean GUELF from Bebange and her
 cousin Pierre KARIGER from Freylange). The couple
 lived in the "Richardshaus".

BONLEZ, Community of the province of Brabant, located 7 Km (kilometer) from Wavre and 35 1/2 kms. from Nivelles, 4kms. from Grez-Doiceau. Elevation: 77.58 meters (measured at the church's steps). Population: 425 inhabitants. Bonlez mesures 857 hectares.

It belongs to the civil arrondissement of Nivelles and to the justice of the peace canton of Wavre.

The parish belongs to the archdiocese of Malines.

General terrain rough, soil mainly clay and sandy.

Agriculture, linnen (flax) spinning mgf., woods, tumulus.

Waterways: the Train and the Glabais, tributaries of the Dyle. Fountains and/or springs.

The route from Wavre to Huy crosses the territory of Bonlez. There is an old castle

Bonlez was spelled Bonlei (1175), Boulers (1171 and 1637), and Bouleir (XII, XIII, XIV, and XV c.) which became Boulter, Bouleir, Boleir and Boulez. We also find the spelling Balleir (1374), Bauller (1542) and Bonley (1666), the preferred spelling of Bonlez was adopted.

Under the Old Regime, Bonlez was under the jurisdiction of Grez's townhall, and was included in the year III (French Republican Calendar) to Grez canton which was united in 1822 to that of Wavre. The village of Bonlez had 2 jurisdictions which both followed the custom of Louvain.

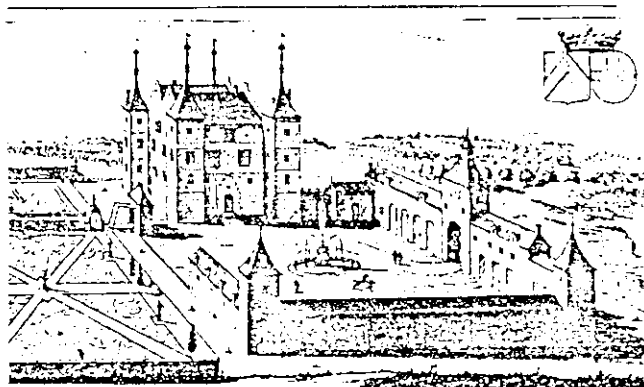
In the 15th century, a branch of the DE WALHAIN family owned Bas-Bonlez (Lower section of Bonlez), from which they received revenues (rents, woods, fines).

The DEL HERBE farm gave its name to a family which owned (XIV c.) an important part of the Dion-le-Val lordship.

Haut-Bonlez before becoming part of the Bonlez barony had the RIPEMONTS as lords. One of them, named Jacques, is listed in 1312, as having revenues from Dion-le-Val which was part of the Duchy of Brabant; the "Latynsboeck" of that year, also lists him as mayor of Gembloux. Baudouin DE GLYMES succeeded the RIPEMONTS and left his estate to his descendants; the HOSDEN family inherited Bonlez thru the marriage of one of their family members to Adrienne DE GLYMES. In 1542, the two Bonlez suffered much from the ravage of the VAN ROSSEM troops.

Note the steady decline of the population, in 1966 only 290 people are living in Bonlez.

In Haut-Bonlez (High-Bonlez) the DE GLYMES family had also revenues + a court of justice. Later the two sections of Bonlez were under the same masters, in both cases the right to administer the High Justice was rented out for 800 lbs. (17 Aug. 1630) and in 1643, Dec. 7, was sold for 1800 lbs. in addition to the 800 lbs of rent.

Christophe VAN ETTEN, Lord of Couwerboch, was the first lord high judicial officer of Bonlez, (relief dated May 10, 1625). Sire Louis-Francois VERREYCKEN, son of Louis VERREYCKEN, knight, lord of Sart or Laurensart, etc., acquired Bonlez as the brother-in-law of VAN ETTEN. Jacques Joseph DE VERREYCKEN, viscount DU BREUCQ and Philippe-Francois-Roger DE VARRICK, count of Sart, lord of Court-St-Etienne, received Bonlez, the first on April 15, 1740, the second on the preceding March 14, he kept Bonlez as his possession which later went to Francois Bernard Henri Roger VANDER GRACHT, baron of Rommerswael de WREMDE (relief dated May 21, 1785), than to his brother-in-law, Leopold de GAVRE, son of Francois Joiseph Rase, prince de GAVRE (relief dated July 25, 1788). In the Year XIII, a Dutch nobleman, Baron DE LOCKHORST, knight of the Lion Belgique, etc., bought Bonlez which he left, after his death, to his daughter, Hermine de LCOKHORST de TOLL and VEENHUYZEN, widow of F.W. de HEECKEREN de NETTELHORST, she married on Oct. 15, 1829, Charles Napoleon Francois, Joseph, duke of LOOZ-CORSWAREM.

The primitive fiefdom of Bonlez that depended of Walhain, grew and became a barony in 1643 for Louis-Francois VERREYCKEN, knight, and when its annexation to the County of Sart was ordered (1675) it had high, middle, low judicial courts, a castle, a feudal court, etc..
