Marjorie STONE has the following surnames in her grandmother's lines: BONDEEL or BLONDELL, HENY, LEFEVRE, GIJSELINCK, MAESSENS from the Egem and Loppem areas of West Flanders. On her grandfather's side, the names researched are: MAHIEU, LIEDERMAN, NOTTERMAN, LEFEVRE from Nazareth and St. Eloois-Vijve also located in West Flanders.

In July 1985 the Commercial-News of Danville, Ill. had the misfortune to publish an article in which was stated that "Belgium was nothing", by her strongly worded and spirited "letter to the editor" Mildred HAMICK gave them the educative lecture that the newspaper needed so badly. She informed them that the Danville region abounds with Belgians who had come around 1870 to work in the mines, most of them, like her ancestors (the MAUREZ) were from Cuesmes, HT. She described the beauty of Belgium which she visited twice and mentioned the suffering of the Belgians during World War II. We can safely assume that the Commercial-News will never, never again print such derogatory statement about Belgium!

The cradle of the DELROT family is located in Stambrugges, near Beloeil, HT, where Hughes, the first ancestor of Jean Pierre DELROT was born in 1655. The name can be spelled many ways: DE LE ROY, DELROY, DELEROYEE, DELERDID, DELERDIST, DELEROST, DELRAU, DELRO. In fact, in a document dated June 1692, the scribe spelled Hughes's name DELROY, while Hughes signed it DELROT. Jean Pierre would like to know if any DELROT or DELROY emigrated to the United States. (We find some DELROY men acting as witnesses in a Jeannette, Pa., declaration of intend to become U.S. citizen.

Rosalie on 7 Apr 1880, she was born in Tavieres on 22 Feb 1856. CORROY Jean Baptiste born in Tavieres on 11 Mar 1849 married in Mataone, BIERHART Marie Victorine born 16 Dec 1855, they had one child CORROY Desire Donat Martin born in Tavieres on 11 Nov 1879. DENIS Henri born in Mehaigne on 4 June 1834 was the widower of EVRARD Marie Josephe who died 18 May 1875, their children all born Tavieres were: Gustave born 22 Dec 1862, Marie Esperance born 27 Nov 1865, Antoine born 25 March 1867, Louis born 16 Sept 1868 and Marie born 19 Nov 1870. EVRARD Eugene born Tavieres 30 June 1842. GELINNE Francois born Tavieres 5 Dec 1810 was the widower of CLAUDE Marie Therese who died 20 Oct 1871, they had one child: Juliette born in Tavieres 16 Dec 1849. HOBIN Arnould born Neerhylssem on 21 Feb 1842 and Marie born 13 May 1874, their children: Josephine born Tavieres 14 April 1875 and Clemence Marie born in Tavieres on 20 Oct 1876. STIMART Adrien born Tavieres ca. 1860, went back to Tavieres 1891, left again same year for U.S. was back in Tavieres in 1894. TIREUR Louis born Tavieres 11 Aug 1832, married 21 June 1877 BERGILEZ Marie Julie, only the husband left Belgium.

Other omitted on the passenger list were BERGER Ferdinand, born Marine husband of PREVOT Alphonsine born Noville sur Mehaigne + one child Marie Florentine born Tavieres 16 Aug 1877. JOACHIM Hubert born Boneffe, husband of BELINNE Marie Joseph who was born in Tavieres + children: Josephine, Ambroise, Jean Baptiste.

He notes also that the person listed as Joseph TANSAY in the "Sea Lark" N.Y. Passenger List 27 Apr 1856, is none other than Joseph ROUSSOU from Tavieres, Nr, he was the husband of Marie Therese TORDEUR, same list, instead of COCHART read COCHART (from Ennace), and Jean Baptiste GUIMARD's wife was Marie Joseph BOUFFIOLX not BAMPNOIS, they were also from Ennace, Damien DELCHARLINE from Villersoux is in fact DELCHARLINE.

The partial passenger list that foliocs was sent by Father DUCAT received it from Dorothy Lutowski. The year is 1854, the ship, the "Julia Howard", Capt. Rufus COLE, the port is probably New Orleans. The information interparenteses () was added by Father DUCAT. All came from Belgium.

We found an important piece of information that had been buried and forgotten in Father DUCAT's folder (every member of TER has a plain manila folder, except for Father DUCAT's which is purple -just in case, had he been made a cardinal we would have been ready!). It is a complaint sent to the Belgian Consulat in ? N.Y.??, protesting the abuses that they were subjected to during the crossing over to the U.S. and it is signed using only last names (here alphabetized) by: ANTOINE, ANTOINE, ASS, BORREYNS, BOURGENSE, COGNOUL, CORBISIER, DACHELET, DALMONT, DEBELVEZ?, DECOSTER, DECAMBE, DEJOBOUT?, DEPAIN, DEKEYSER, DELMONT, DEPROX (DEPREUX?) DETRY, DEVEVERG?, DUBOIS, DUCHESENE, DUPONT, ETSCHIED, FRALPONT, FRANK, GEJEZ, GENORIN/JANDRAIN?, GIELEN, GOFFART, HERLACHE, INCEZOS, JACQUES, JACQUES, JAVIES, LACROIX, LAROSE, LEMENGER, LEROSE, LIESSE, MARCHANT, MENAGNOUL, MEYER, NOLIN, THIELEN, VANLIER, VERDOODT, WILLANE.

The name of the boat is not given, nor is a date, but it is assumed that this happened in late June or early July since we know thru population registers that a DACHELET Julien left Mont-St. Andre on 18 June 1856, that a INGEBOS Constant left Jandrain on 15 June 1856 and that LEMENGER Francois Xavier left Maleves-Ste Marie on 10 June 1856. The date of arrival and the name of the boat shouldn't be too hard to find.

Those of you of Luxembourg descent my be interested by the report of N.Y. Belgian Consul, Mr. H.W. Halli written in late 1854 or beginning 1855, which mentions that a Belgian, Mr. Henrich, former in Sheldon, N.Y. and originally from Messancy, Lx, had stated that Sheldon, Wycaing Co., about 10 miles from Buffalo is the site of an important Belgian settlement comprising about 100 Belgian families, + 20 French families + many Germans. And that every family made their own bread, sugar, cider, soap and candles... Other settlements mentioned in the report (but no specifics given) are Green Bay, Port Washington-Wisconsin, Leopold-Indiana, Indiana-Indiana and the following states: Pennsylvania, Michigan, Louisiana, New Jersey.

Raymond GILSOUL found some good news in regards to Jeanne RICUX REYNESSEIER's ancestry, he sent the birth record dated 19 May 1815 of Louis MARCHANT who was born in Jandrain-Jandrenouille on 18 May 1815, son of Harman Joseph MARCHANT, oilman, and his wife Marie Albertine Joseph ALLARD (a native of Jodoigne-St.Lambert). The mayor and the witnesses who signed the records were: Pierre Michel FRESIN, Jean Guillaume HOUART, and Mayor RENARD. It so happened that Raymond's colleague, Gustave VANDY, is preparing a paper regarding the history of the place called Jauche-la-Barne, which is located in Jandrain and where stood an oil mill that was ran by the MARCHANT family. They would like as much informations as possible about Louis MARCHANT and his descendants in the U.S. and about his brother, Telesphore MARCHANT (and any descendants that he might have had) who settled in Dyckesville, Wi., where he was a brewer, this after 30 April 1857. If you have informations about the MARCHANT families, please contact Raymond GILSOUL, Avenue Wilmart, 35, 5920 Perwez, Belgium.

The photocopied page of Louis MARCHANT's birth record showed other birth record fragments: 1) Pierre Joseph VANHAL, son of Jean Baptiste and Henriette MOTTE; and 2) of Jean Louis MARECHAL, son of Francois and Marie Catherine. SCHVILLE.

 21 Aug. 1804, birth of Bernardus DE LEURERE, at Zulzeke, son of Bernardus DE LEURERE, farmer, and of Marie Joseph HOURS?
 18 March 1810, birth of Melanie OPSOMER at Kwaremont, she was the daughter of Jean Baptiste OPSOMER, farmer, and of Rosalie VAN DE PUTTS.
 22 May 1777, baptism of Bernardus DELEURERE at Kwaremont, he was the son of Franciscus DELEURERE and of Maria Carola D'HEERE.

Virginia and Clement DEROD attended the DE PAPE/DE ROO family reunion at Holland, Manitoba on 3 Aug. 1985, this is what they have to say: "Over 300 descendants of the two families who emigrated from East Flanders to Manitoba in the 1890s attended the reunion. They came from many parts of Canada as well as from the U.S., some from as far as California, West Virginia, and of course, from Florida. The Community Hall in Holland was used for the reunion, a complete dinner was served (buffet style) with all anyone could want to eat, right down to the last person. All of this was done at the nominal cost of Canadian \$ 10.00 per person. This was accomplished only because of the long hours and hard work by many volunteers. It amazes me how close the descendants of the original Belgian immigrants have remained, and I do not necessarily mean geographically. There is a strong attachment among all in the family. Although it was twelve years between the first reunion and this one in 1985, it was decided that there would be another in five years. Naturally, we plan to attend. After the reunion, we flew to Salt Lake City to attend the National Genealogical Society Conference, which we thoroughly enjoyed. We concentrated on the writing and publishing lectures and I attended several of the sessions regarding computers in genealogy. The primary deterrent to my buying a compute at my stage of research is the horrible thought of the work necessary to enter all my accumulated data. There were other sessions we attended that dealt with specific areas of interest but none dealing with Belgium. After the Conference, we stayed on for five days to do some research at the LDS Library and have the following comments: Reproductions from "hard copy" were only five cents per page and from "film" or "microfiche" only 10 cents per page. Consequently, it is often to your advantage to reproduce for later home study than it is to spend precious time on the readers looking for something. The LDS booklet "Major Genealogical Record Sources for Belgium". Series B, No.3, 1976, was being revised and should have been out by the end of 1985.

A booklet on the Conversion Tables, French Republican Calendar, Gregorian Calendar, by John A. Dahl, 1972, is available from Deseret Book Press, P.O. Box 39178, Salt Lake City, Utah 84130. The cost of the booklet is only \$ 1.50 and is an excellent aid for researchers who encounter this calendar. I only wish I had known about this booklet before I spent so much time learning to understand the calendar.
 The New LDS Library building in Salt Lake City is not expected to have available the solids used films. This means that Belgian films will not be there. While talking with the attendants in the old library, I casually mentioned my interest in Belgian films and was told that some were available "downstairs". I am not sure where this

is but they had a microfiche listing of films that could be brought up for my use within one to two hours. After preparing a list of sixteen films, I found that ten of them were available. Whether or not this same situation will exist in the new Library **, I do not know, but it would be well worth while asking about it if you are there."

* Photocopies of documents can be ordered thru the mail, but one has to know the film or fiche number and book and page numbers too. The cost is 25 cents per photocopy with a minimum order of \$ 1.00. Your LDS genealogical library has forms that you can use to request photocopies.

** In the ENSIGN, December 1985, p. 70, David M. Mayfield, director of the Member Services Division of the Genealogical Department states in addition to the 5 floors that the new building has, there is also a compact underground storage area, this area, ingeniously designed with movable stacks to increase storage capacity, can hold 200,000 more rolls of microfilm and 70,000 more books than could be stored previously. Up to now, people wanting to use these little used materials have had to wait while the items were transferred from the Granite Mountain vault in Little Cottonwood Canyon. Other interesting details: Up to 3 new floors can and will be added to the new building as growth dictates; on average the Library records 2,000 visits each day, there are 1,500,000 rolls of microfilms and 170,000 books available.

Please check your telephone books for the name OLIEUX/OLIEU and forward names and addresses to Pierre INGHELS, Fruitdale Rt 3 Box 3161, LaGrande, Oregon 97859. Our best wishes to the INGHELS for a most pleasant and happy stay in Germany.

Ruth C. SCHIELTZ, 11820 Reed Rd., Versailles, Ohio 45380, was in Europe last summer, her son was with her for the first two weeks. They visited Arlon but didn't go to the Archives Center. They stopped to see a few friends including Mrs. George SCHWEITZER and her son Pierre who speaks English so well and who has been most helpful in locating records needed for Ruth's research. The last two weeks of her trip were spent travelling with her uncle thru Holland, Liege, Bastogne and the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg; they went to the Margrave American Military Cemetery in Holland, looking for the grave of a soldier and were told that he was buried at the American Military Cemetery at Henri-Chapelle in Belgium. While they were there they talked with some Belgians who had lived through the Battle of the Bulge, and were told that Belgian people have adopted the soldiers at the cemetery and place flowers on their graves on special days. They also learned that the

Belgians really love Americans. The Belgian people with whom they spoke knew no English, Ruth and her uncle knew no French, so they communicated in German...

It was a good trip for Ruth, unfortunately, painful time awaited her as her sister was gravely ill and died on Sept. 24. Ruth would like us to know that an important book, **LUXEMBOURGERS IN THE NEW WORLD** will be published soon by Editions Relieuses SCHORTGEN, 43, rue Marie-Heller-Tesch, L4250 Esch-Alzette, GD Luxembourg, in the U.S. it will be available for \$ 10.00 from Robert E. OASEN, Heritage Surveys, Box 344, 809 Carrie Court, Mc Lean, Va. 22101 This 400+ pages book contains many informations about Luxembourgers from the Grand-Duchy and probably also from Belgium. It is a reedition/translation of Nicholas GONNER **DIE LUXEMBURGER IN DER NEUEN WELT**, Dubuque, Iowa, 1889, it deals with the Luxembourg emigration and its causes from 1840-1890, the Luxembourg settlements in the United States, occupations and activities of the Luxembourgers in America, + the publishers have added a previously unpublished index of 40,000 names and places, selected ship manifests with names of Luxembourg immigrants prior to 1890, inventory of available sources on emigrants in the State Archives of the Grand-Duchy, a gazetteer of the Grand Duchy + useful hints for the genealogical researcher.

Since we are on the subject of Luxembourgers, let's talk about Martha's good fortune in finding the marriage record of her ancestors. She had previously contacted the townhalls of Hachy, Habay and the State Archives at Arlon, but to no avail, they were unable to find the desired record. She then contacted Jean MULLER, 78, rue du Luxembourg, 6720 Habay-la-Neuve, Belgium, who is the publisher of **LE PAYS DE HABAY**. Very kindly Mr. MULLER went out of his way and found the marriage record of Michel THEIS and Anne Marie COURTOIS who were married in Mondelange (and not Hachy like other sources state) on July 4, 1810. The record states that Michel THEIS was born in Hachy on 15 Feb 1765 and was the son of Bernard THEIS and Marguerite MATHIEU who had died in Hachy on 22 Feb. 1826, and that Anne Marie COURTOIS was born in Wolkeange on 24 May 1763, daughter of Pierre COURTOIS who had died on 1 March 1794 and of Suzanne HAUPEY. Beside this record, Mr.

MULLER also included other informations about the children (all born in Hachy) of that couple.

The **LE PAYS DE HABAY** is a MONTHLY bulletin which gives an account of social, intellectual, historical goings-ons of past and present-day Habay region which includes Arlier, Habay-la-Neuve, Habay-la-Vicille, Hachy, Harinsart, Houdoumont, Harbaban, Montigny, Ossinfaing, Rullas, le Fort D'Oye and la Trognette. The region was part at one time of the Belge de Castillon and was referred to by that name. The price of subscription to **LE PAYS DE HABAY** is not mentioned, we venture to say that \$ 10.00 should cover it.

Our congratulations to Father Jacques FERRIERE, rue du Sereinaine 7, 5700 Floreffe, Belgium, not only for publishing on a regular basis **CLANES**, a highly regarded Floreffe bulletin, but also for the excellent historical and genealogical research that he conducted. We thank him for so graciously sharing it with us.

CLANES # 26, Christmas 1985, bears the title "Those who brought about FLOREFFE, in Pennsylvania, U.S.A." (in French) and the subtitle "Our American Uncles". It gives not only names of the settlers but also short genealogical sketches. Florent ROBAUX was born in Floreffe, Belgium in 1859 and came to this country in 1893 to work in the glass manufacturing industry, his wife Ferdinande GRETZER and 2 daughters followed in 1894, they settled in Larimer where they enjoyed some very good years, Unfortunately disaster will strike this family with the death of Ferdinande on Christmas Eve 1899. Florent ROBAUX and his children returned to Belgium in 1905. His grand-daughter still has the rocking-chair that he brought back with him. In 1979, Madeleine THIRY, grand-daughter of Florent and Ferdinande

ROBAUX came to the Pittsburgh region to try to discover the grave of her grandmother Ferdinande GRETZER-ROBAUX but was not able to. It would be a nice gesture if someone in our organization could locate that grave, more details are available.

There is also mention of the two Henri MARCHAL, who were first cousin, one was born in Floreffe on 30 April 1865, left in 1893, one of his children Antonin died on board. This family was back in Belgium by 1899. The other Henri MARCHAL was born in Floreffe in 1886 and left on his own for the U.S. where he married Anita ROSSAME, daughter of a Belgian emigrant. The name MARCHAL became MARSHALL in the states, many descendants of this couple can still be found in Pennsylvania. Other Belgian names found in Fort City, Pa., are: BLOCHIAUX, THIRY, MARIQUE, MICHAUX, DEREUX, TOUSSAINT, SAMBREY, BUREAU, FAULX, TALLIER, DEMER, DELACROIX, HANSSOITE.

Joseph Etienne BIERBAUX and his brother, Dieudonne BIERBAUX emigrated to the U.S. prior 1895. Joseph Etienne drowned in 1895 on his way to work and his widow and children went back to Belgium. Dieudonne BIERBAUX left the glass industry work, he and his wife Julie PORIGNAUX took over a farm in Lock, Pa. and made a successful venture out of it. Felix and Joseph THIRY left Floreffe, Belgium for the U.S. Joseph, a farmer, died and his wife returned to Belgium, Felix remained and was employed in Charleroi, Pa. in the glass industry. Desire JOIRET is another emigrant mentioned in **CLANES**, he had married Marie Joseph CLARENBAUX, after her death, he married another Belgian, Julie COTTEN. Nothing much is known about the whereabouts of Pierre TOUSSAINT who left Floreffe for the U.S. and never contacted his family in Belgium after that.

Pat FETTITT, 11448 - 42 Ave., Edmonton, Alberta T6J 0W3, Canada, has made up a source book of all of the surnames (there are many) that she is researching, all are listed in alphabetical order with all relative information for each name. One page per line. She found her source book most helpful. We think this to be an excellent idea that might save a lot of work to those of us who are not as organized as we should.

If we weren't so proud of her work, we would probably be green with envy, (the luck of that person! we call it luck for lack of a better word, actually we realize that 99% work is behind such "luck". We are referring here to Sandra DOBBIE continued success in finding MORE informations about her ancestor Dominique VAN NIEBER. She reports that "The lists of French prisoners at Halifax 1809-1814 are just beautiful. Dominique was a captain aboard "La Furieuse" captured bound from Guadaloupe for France. Taken as prize by HMS "La Bonne Citoyenne", Dominique and 177 others from "La Furieuse" were interned at Halifax on 2 August 1809, one day before Dominique's 29th birthday!"

The August 1809 HALIFAX GAZETTE reported the event under the title: **BRITISH BRAVERY** - Has been once more most brilliantly displayed in the capture of the enemy's Frigate LA FURIEUSE, of 46 guns on the 6th by LA BONNE CITOYENNE, Capt. HADLEY, of 18 guns, after an engagement of 6 hours and 51 minutes. LA FURIEUSE had 71 men killed and wounded - LA BONNE CITOYENNE but one killed and six wounded. The French frigate is laden with sugar, coffee and cocoa and was bound from Guadaloupe to France. LA BONNE CITOYENNE chased the enemy 20 hours. We cannot help congratulating our readers on this extraordinary action. Seldom has the valour of British seamen been better crowned with happier success.

Capt. MOUNSEY's report of the event, published in THE NAVAL CHRONICLE for 1809, Vol. XXII, mentions that he sailed from Spithead on the 10th of June (1809), with HM ship INFLEXIBLE and the QUEBEC trade, that on July 2nd, the 1st sight of the convoy, as he tried to regain the fleet the came across a French frigate trying to overtake a large English merchant ship, the French frigate (none other than LA FURIEUSE) fled with LA BONNE CITOYENNE in pursuit, after a chase that lasted over 18 hours LA BONNE CITOYENNE and LA FURIEUSE engaged in combat which lasted for 6 hours and 50 minutes after which LA FURIEUSE surrendered. LA FURIEUSE is further described as being a fast frigate of the largest

SHAWNEE TOWNSHIP.

NB Lenia CASIER is Margaret's mother, here listed with her first husband, Henry CASIER. August CASIER listed immediately preceding is Henry's brother. Other relatives listed are Julius LECLUYSE and wife Julie, children and Julie's mother Rosalia VERSTRET who was married to Petrus SOETAERT. He died 4 Sept 1893 and she came to America in 1897 to be with her children. The following was found by Sylvère VAN WAELE in the diary of the village constable of Egen. "On Wednesday 14 Oct. 1891, at 4 o'clock took place the legal marriage in Egen of Cecil DE L'ECLUSE living in Meulebeke recently returned from America and Julia SOETAERT, lace worker, born in Egen near the VELDEKENS, daughter of Petrus SOETAERT and Rosalie VERSTRAETE. On Friday 16 Oct 1891 they left for America without church wedding. It's said they'll be married in America."
 "On Friday 25 Sept. 1896 left for America Rosalie VERSTRAETE, widow of Petrus SOETAERT and his children as well as the children of Constant SOETAERT who left 21 March 1893."

Constant SOETAERT's wife Mary Blondia COUSSENS had died in Egen on 12 Oct 1892, so the Grandmother Rosalie VERSTRAETE was raising the children and came to America with them. Constant SOETAERT wasn't found in Wyandotte Co. in 1900, so the KIRKPATRICKS' next step will be to check the Johnson Co. 1900 Census which is said to have had a large Belgian community.

We deeply regret to report the death of our fellow member CRAIG TRIAX who passed away on Dec. 27, 1985 after a short illness. Craig's pride in his Walloon forebearers was only exceeded by his pride in and his love for his family. Craig was the author of "Freemen"-Children of the Reformation in Europe and America, 1585-1982. To his mother and his children we offer our sincere condolences.
