To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled "An Act in addition to certain acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," there has been deposited in the General Land Office Warrant No. 66914, for 160 acres, in favor of "Francis C. Mohr, Private, Company B, 1st Regiment, U. S. Dragoons, Apache Indian Disturbances", with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the northwest quarter of Section nineteen in Township seven south of Range twenty-two east of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Kansas, containing one hundred sixty acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor-General; the said Warrant having been duly assigned to Calvin Myers, in whose favor said tract has been located:

NOW KNOW YE, That there is, therefore, granted by the UNITED STATES, unto the said Calvin Myers, and to his heirs, the tract of Land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Calvin Myers, and to his heirs and assigns forever.

This patent is issued in lieu of one dated July 2, 1860, which has been canceled because of an error in the description.
