RECORD OF

Comrade William Basore

The last enemy that shall be destroyed is death!

William Basore was born June 18th 1846 in or near Nabash, County of Nabash, State of Indiana. He was first enlisted in Company E 138th Regiment Indiana Volunteers on the 3rd day of May 1864. He held the office of Private, and served 143 days in the "100 day" service and was honorably discharged September 22nd 1864 by reason of expiration of term of enlistment. He joined this Post No. 145 on January 21st 1893 and held the office of Commander, and D. No. He died Mar. 8, 1939 at aged years, leaving widow and child.

MILITARY HISTORY.

This Comrade also served a second term of enlistment during the war for the suppression of the rebellion, having enlisted as a Private in Co. "D" 159th Regiment of Indiana Volunteer Infantry on the 19th day of February 1865, to serve one year, from which he was honorably discharged August 30th 1865, at Charleston West Virginia, by reason of A.O. No. 28, C.D. No. 2, p. 3, m. v. D. Aug. 28, 1865; having served 6th months therein, and a total military service of eleven months and eight days.

This Comrade after having served Humphrey Post No. 145 Department of Kansas, as Post Commander in 1908-9, and as 2nd M. in 1911, requested, and was granted a transfer, to take effect, January 1st 1912, and removed to Chetopa, Kansas, in the month of December, 1911.
