Item 2: The Nelson Garfield Camp of the SUVCW held their September meeting on Thursday evening Sept. 30 at the Covington library. Our speaker was David Schraeder from the library who spoke on the topic of "Researching Civil War Ancestors."

Dave spoke about one hour reviewing a wide spectrum of Civil War genealogical resources available on the internet and in printed form. He pointed out that service records of the Civil War soldiers were often kept by the officer of the unit and those records did not necessarily follow a soldier if he switched units. This serves to complicate the process of tracking those records down. Pension records, another rich source of information, were kept in a more systematic fashion and were easier to pursue.

Dave discussed many internet sources for research included Ancestry Plus (http://www.kenton.lib.

uslgenealogy.htm), National Archives And Records Administration (www.archives.gov/), National Cemetery Administration (www.cem.va.gov/), Civil War Soldiers And Sailors System (www.itd.nps.gov/CWSS) and the U.S. Civil War Center (www.CWC.lsu.edu).

Printed resources Dave discussed which are available at the library include the  $\underline{1890}$  Census Index Of Civil War Veterans, (KR929.310579e),  $\underline{\text{Civil}}$  War

Genealogy, (KR929.15413c), Confederate Soldiers Of
