1617 Eden Mill Rd; Pylesville, MD 21132


Program: **EDEN MILL – Historic Mill Museum.**

GENEALOGY FEATURE

Digital Image Retrieval System for Land Records

As genealogists, we are provided with an online MD State Archives tool at <http://www.MDLandRec.Net> to trace Maryland deeds backwards. Here is a quick look at how the tool can be used to find deed documents. All of the screen images are extracts of the areas of interest, not the full online page.

The Maryland Judiciary, the 24 elected Court Clerks of Maryland, and the Maryland State Archives have joined in partnership to make available a **Digital Image Retrieval System for Land Records**. This system offers public access to verified land record instruments in Maryland.

Users need to register the first time, but it is a safe site. When completing the online access Application, you are asked to indicate the counties of interest, and you should consider selecting “All Counties.” A “User Guide” is linked from the main page. It is recommended that you review this User Guide before using the system.


In this article, I am going to search for deeds related to the Historical Society of Harford County, Inc. After signing-in, several search selections are available, but I will use the following for our example: **“Search County Land Indices and View Records Begin your search of county land records by selecting a county from list at left”** so I selected Harford County. The next screen provides some background and conditions of use information. Which, by the way, you need to accept in order to continue.

The next screen titled “Harford County Circuit Court,” presents you with several links. I selected **“Search County Land Record Indices, January 1, 1970 - Jun 19, 2008 (verified through Jun 17, 2008)”**. This link takes us to a screen with multiple search styles. I chose the style labeled **“Search for Corporation Name by Soundex”** since the Historical Society of Harford County, Inc. is a corporation.

Upon clicking on the search button, I was presented with a list of six matches to my search on Soundex Code H236 and “Grantees.” First, I discarded all matches except those displaying “**Grantee: HISTORICAL SOCIETY OF HARFORD**” and “**DEED**.” This cut my list down to:

My interest in this example is the HQ building on 143 N Main St, and the deed LIBER 2579 FIOLO 0820. So next, I clicked on the “Volume” reference link to see an image of the deed.



A quick perusal of the document resulted in a reference to the previous deed.

BEING the same and all the land and property described in and conveyed by a Deed from the United States Postal Service to Harford County, Maryland, dated the 2nd day of November, 1990, and recorded among the Land Records of Harford County in Liber C.G.H. No. 1675, folio 770;

Armed with the prior deed reference, I went back to the search page and chose the style labeled **“Search for Instruments by Book and Page.”**

Upon clicking on the search button, I was presented with a list of two matches to my search.

Again, click on the “Volume” reference link to see an image of this deed and locate the prior deed reference.

Depending on your research objectives, you can continue this process backwards until you develop a trail of deeds and owners that satisfies your objective.

Digital Property Assessment Records

If you need an initial deed reference, try visiting the MD Real Property tax database at http://sdatcert3.resiusa.org/rp_rewrite/ The County name and Street Address inquiry gives you an assessment data sheet with current-day deed references.

Here is the first screen, with Harford County already selected. Click on the radio button for your particular Search method, which is most often the **Street Address**.

The next screen prompts for the address. Do not include suffix Rd, Road, St, Hwy, Lane, etc. If you leave the Street number blank, you will get a pick-list of every property on the street that could go on for several pages.

The example here is for the Historical Society of Harford County HQ, to match the Land Records search in the previous example.

When you enter a street number, or have picked an entry from the pick-list, you will be presented with a property data sheet. The assessment data sheet shows the current deed reference in the upper right corner. Recent transactions, shown near the bottom of the data sheet, usually indicate previous deed references that will help reduce your search time. Below is an extract of two sections of the data sheet with deed references (/LIBER/ FOLIO) highlighted.

You may also be able to view a simplistic plat of the property by clicking on **View Map** in the upper right side of the banner, *if the words are red and underlined.*

GENEALOGY RESOURCES

Historical Register

If a house has been on the Historical Register you can review the submission on www.marylandhistoricaltrust.net. Click on the navigation bar link **MHT Inventory Search** for sites in Maryland. Information on the standing structures recorded in the Maryland Inventory of Historic Properties is now available on-line.

In a joint venture with the Maryland State Archives, the Maryland Historical Trust had some 33,000 paper forms and photographs scanned to produce an electronic version of the inventory (Baltimore City is not included). Entries are searchable by property name, address, or keywords in the inventory text. Results are a simplistic Inventory form listing: Name of the site, Address, Classification, Property Owner, Location of Legal description (Deed), and Representation in Existing Surveys.

Click on the navigation bar link **National Register Search** for sites in Maryland under two groupings. Entries are searchable by Property Name, Address, Keyword, and County. Results are typically a photograph, Identification details, plus approximately 200-700 words of Description and Significance.

Maryland's **National Register of Historic Places** recognizes districts, buildings, structures, objects, and sites for their significance in American history, archeology, architecture, engineering, or culture, and identifies them as *worthy of preservation*. This inventory currently comprises 1293 listings in Maryland, including 183 historic districts.

Maryland's **National Historic Landmarks** recognizes buildings, districts, sites, structures, or objects that are officially *recognized by the United States government for their historical significance*. This inventory currently comprises 81 listings in Maryland.
