Jasper Stahl Memorial Fund

The Jasper J. Stahl Memorial Fund was established in August 2008 as a way for the OBBFHA to endow individuals and organizations that are working to promote the preservation of the genealogy and history of the Waldoboro area. Since 2008 money from the Stahl Fund has been donated for the restoration of the 1816 Robinson Map of Waldoboro and, this year, \$300 dollars was donated to the Waldoboro Public Library for a two year membership to the New England Historic Genealogical Society which will allow library patrons to have free access to the AmericanAncestors.org research database.

Annual meeting and reunion

The annual meeting and reunion of the Old Braod Bay Family History Association will be held Saturday, August 6 at the University of Maine Cooperative Extension, Knox and Lincoln Counties (lower level), 377 Manktown Road, Waldoboro. A \$5 donation is requested. Coffee and snacks are provided.

The business meeting will begin at 9:00 followed by the speaker at 10:00; both are open to the public. The speaker will be Peg Kearney who will present *An Imperfect Union: The Eighteenth Century Origins of the Two Maines*, which covers the Charter of 1691, the Waldo Patent, and the political, social, and legal controversies arising from these documents in Waldoboro and throughout Maine. Ms Kearney holds a bachelors degree in history from the University of Southern Maine and a masters in history from the University of Maine.

Those staying for the reunion and genealogy discussions should bring a bag lunch. There is a refrigerator and microwave available.

Association elections

Newsletter cuts

Due to problems with obtaining articles for publication in the newsletter, the OBBFHA Board of Directors, at its meeting in Waldoboro on June 18, decided to cut back on newsletter publication. Starting immediately, the newsletter will be published three times a year, in April (Spring), July (Summer), and October (Fall). Further, the Summer issue will be four pages rather than eight. Of course, should sufficient articles be received, the Summer issue can be increased to eight pages.

MGS 2011 Family History Conference

The Maine Genealogical Society's annual conference will be held Saturday, September 24, at the Spectacular Event Center in Bangor. The featured speaker will be Meldon "Mel" Wolfgang, III, the founder and owner of Jonathan Shepard Books. Mr. Wolfgang will present the keynote address (*Uncommon Research Tools That Can Lead to Uncommonly Good Results*) and two additional talks, *Beyond the Basics: Tips & Techniques for Using Newspapers in Genealogical Research* and *More Than Almshouses and Cold Charity: Exploring Family History in the Records of Public and Private Assistance in New England*.

Other speakers are Lynda Sudlow (The Role of Women in the Civil War), Helen Shaw (Often

Overlooked: What the Census Tells You Beyond Name & Age), Brian Bouchard (Using Social Media in Genealogical Research), and Susan Almy (More Than Wills: Using Probate Records in Genealogical Research).

New Waldoboro book available

Citizens Who Heard the Call to Political Service: Waldoboro, Maine 1773-2010 by Jean M. B. Lawrence. This book celebrates the lives of Waldoboro citizens who served in the U.S. Senate or House of Representatives, the Maine legislature, three Maine Governors, and five representatives to the General Court of Massachusetts in Boston prior to 1820. Researched images and original photos enhance the accounts of public service commitment from early migrant inhabitants to current elected legislators. The book is being sold at the Waldoborough Historical Society and copies will be on sale at our meeting: \$15.70, tax included. All proceeds go to the Waldoborough Historical Society.

Membership

The Old Broad Bay Family History Association is a group of people interested in studying and maintaining the history of the founding families, and in particular the founding German families, of what is now Waldoboro, Lincoln County, Maine.

A library membership is solely for the purpose of allowing distribution of the newsletter to libraries and historical societies and confers no right to vote.
