Brigham Young University's Family History Archive provides access to a host of family histories. The Archive's search engine allows you to search by keyword, geographical area, title or author. For example, I entered the surname Mower as a keyword, and it retrieved two books—one being the *Mower Family History—A Genealogical Record of the Maine Branch of this family*. By selecting this item's title, I was able to view the entire book digitally. The file is displayed using Adobe Reader, so if you have not already downloaded it, you'll need to download Adobe Reader in order to view and print these files. This is a fantastic resource for genealogists and it's free! The Archive currently has over 3000 volumes available and is seeking contribution of personal family histories—information can be obtained on the website.
