- Court of Policy; Address of condolence and sympathy to the Queen on the death of the Princess Alice; Berbice Volunteer Corps constituted by proclamation of the Governor; Dr. J.T. ALEXANDER died at Barbados
- 5 Governor and Mrs. KORTRIGHT left in R.M. Steamer *Tiber* for Antigua
- 6 Meeting of Court of Policy; The Hon. Wm. A.G. YOUNG sworn in as Lieut.-Governor
- Meeting of the Town Council; Mr. B. V. ABRAHAM elected Mayor of Georgetown in the place of the Hon. R. P. DRYSDALE, whose term of service expired
- 10 Board of Education; A committee appointed to revise the rules of the Board
- Court of Policy; Discussions on navigation of the port, the W. I. & P. Telegraph Co.'s Charges and recovery of overdue acre-money

- 7 The Bargue *Malabar* arrived from Calcutta with immigrants
- 8 Mr. In Thurn and Mr. Edwardes-Moss left town on an expedition to the Kaieteur Falls
- 10 Death of Mr. G. C. BROADHEAD of H.M. Custom House
- Rev. George ROBB resigned the office of Minister of St. Mark's Parish
- 17 Telegraphic communication with Trinidad interrupted
- Mr. Edmund Thornton HENERY of Pln. Providence, Berbice, elected a member in room of Mr. A. C. McCALMAn; The Rev. J. GREATHEAD and Mr. H. WATSON elected members of Board of Education
- March 1 Mr. Robert SMITH and Mr. R. T. A. DALY appointed members of the Central Board of Health; Mr. A.M. ABBOTT appointed provisionally to be clerk to the Magistrate of the Mahaica Judicial District; Mr. R.L. GREAVES appointed to act as a Commissary of Taxations attached to the Georgetown District
 - The ship *Poonah* arrived from Calcutta with immigrants; A disturbance occurred on the Corentyne Coast between the coolies of Skeldon and Eliza and Mary during the celebration of the tadjah festival; Messrs. Im THURN and Edwards-MOSS returned to town from the Kaieteur Falls
 - 12 Anniversary Meeting of Guiana Diocesan Church Society
 - Mr. Alex. FRASER provisionally appointed Sub-Accountant of Essequebo; Mr. R. S. F. LAMBERT, Commissary of Taxation, appointed Aid-Waiter in the Customs Department; Mr. John SOLOMON appointed Commissary of Taxation of the Essequebo River District; Mr. A. E. BOWEN appointed sixth clerk in the Receiver General's Office
 - Meeting of the Court of Policy: An application received from Mr. Quintin HOGG, that Government should advance him \$43,000 in consideration of the wall built at Pln. Bel Air, referred to the Combined Court
 - A coolie named MOOLTAN was run over by the Demerara Railway at *Bachelor's Adventure* and died in the Colonial Hospital; Arrival of the Bargue *Dartmouth* from Hong Kong with 52 Chinese immigrants
 - Arrival of the ship *Howrah* from Calcutta with 525 Indian immigrants; The Governor and Mrs. Kortright visited the Penal Settlement
 - 19 Loss of the yacht *Madge* off the East Coast; the crew rescued by the police
 - 22 A coolie named RAMDEEN executed at Essequebo for the murder of his wife
 - Destructive fire in Robb's Town. The premises of Bourne and Co., W.B. Jamieson, C. Cahuac and the wholesale department of Playfair & Co. were destroyed

- Mr. Thomas FITZGERALD, Commissary of Taxation, appointed a Special Justice of the Peace fo rthe colony of British Guiana and Acting stipendiary Justice of the Peace for the East Bank Demerara River
- Governor and Mrs. Kortright sailed for Southampton; The Hon. W.A.G. YOUNG Lieut.-Governor assumed the administration of the Government
- 9 Mr. H. SPROSTON, Jr., elected Town counciller for North Cumingsburg, West Municipal Ward
- 12 Mr. J.N.L. BACKER appointed Acting Auditor General
- Mr. F. A. GALL provisionally appointed Superintendent of the Reformatory at Oaderneemina; Mr. George Thorne WHITE provisionally appointed assistance Superintendent of H.M. Penal Settlement
- Mr. D.M. GALLAGHER appointed Acting Comptroller of Customs during the temporary absence from the Colony of Mr. H. W. AUSTIN; and Mr. F. O. KING appointed Acting Registrar of Demerara and Essequebo during the temporary absence of Mr. E.H.G. DALTON

- 17 Mr. Thomas Henry MACKEY died
- Mr. P.H.R. HILL appointed acting magistrate of the West Coast, Demerara Judicial District; Mr. F. E. DAMPIER appointed Magistrate of the West Bank, Demerara Judicial District

- W. S. BOURNE acquitted of the charge of arson in the Supreme Criminal Court

- Death of Mr. W. B. EDDY, second master of Queen's College at St. Vincent
- 27 Arrival of the new Colonial steamer *Guiana* from London
- 29 First appearance of A Verdade (The Truth), a Portuguese newspaper, in Georgetown
- The barque *Lightning* left the river with 566 returning immigrant for Calcutta
- Death of Mr. Nathaniel CHAPMAN, 61 years a resident of this colony, in his 80th year

September

- 1 The Berbice Gazette purchased by Mr. C. E. HOOTEN
- 2 The barque *Malabar* left the river with 551 returning immigrants for India
- 3 Mr. John A. DAIZIEL appointed First Marshal in the office of the Provost Marshal
- 4 News received of the death, at Plymouth, of Mr. Samuel BOOKER
- 9 Death of Mr. D. SCRUBY
- 11 A Portuguese shopkeeper named PERES, arrested on a charge of arson; acquitted
- The new lightship *Georgetown*, built at Amsterdam, arrived in the harbour
- 15 Mr. G. C. B. MULLER, Manager of *Taymouth Manor*, died at Martinique
- 19 Death of Mr. Robert SANDLAND, of the firm of Pasley, Templeton & Co.
- Serious fire in Russell and Saffon Streets, Charlestown; Sudden death of Mr. A. B. MORRISON at Pln. Everton, Berbice
- 24 Mr. B. V. ABRAHAM elected Town Councillor for Stabroek ward
- 27 Death of Mr. F. F. CAMACHO, an old Portuguese colonist; Formal opening of the Georgetown Tramway by His Excellency, the Lieutenant Governor
- The barque *Victoria* of London burnt in the port of Georgetown
- Pln. *Goedverwagting* was purchased by Mr. Edmund FIELD on behalf of Messrs. LAMBERT, the mortgages, for \$41,000

October

- Mr. B. S. BAYLEY re-elected Town Councillor for South Cumingsburg and Albert Town East Ward; The wreck of the barque *Victoria* was sold at auction for \$730; a megass logie on Pln. *Ogle* destroyed by fire; Colonel George Foster FOSTER appointed Magistrate of the West Coast (Demerara) Judicial District
- 14 Concert in the Philharmonic Hall, in aid of St. Philip's Church Fund
- 19 The shop of Mr. John JONES, in water Street, was broken into and about \$750 in gold stolen
- Fire on Pln. *Ruimveldt* two megass logies burnt; Fire on Pln. *Goedverwagting* a megass logie burnt
- Fire on Pln. Farm, East Bank two megass logies burnt. A coolie was accidentally run over by a tramway car in Water Street and killed
- 29-30 Georgetown Races

November

- 1 The steamship *Benona*, the first of a new line of steamers to run between this colony and Liverpool, arrived here
- 10 The Lassa and Plassey arrived form Calcutta with immigrants
- The German carrette *Medusa* (training ship) arrived from Bahia; Mr. Josias BOOKER elected a member of the Court of Policy in the room of Mr. A. C. McCALMAN, who has left the colony
- Mr. H. BARCLAY Temporarily appoint S.J.P. of the Demerara River District; Mr. Im THURN, Curator of othe Museum, and Mr. JENMAN, Government Botanist, returned from a two-months' stay up the Corentyne River
- 14 A megass logie on Pln. *Ogle* was burnt
- The Troopship *Tamar* arrived from Barbados with a detachment of othe 1st. W. I. Regiment; Mr. Ernest E. WIGHT appointed to act as Assistant Crown Surveyor
- Mr. Henry BALDWIN, clerk with Messrs. BOOKER Brothers and Co., committed suicide
- 17 The Troopship *Tamar* sailed for Honduras with a detachment of the 2nd W.I. Regiment

- 19 The sloop *Exelina*, bound from Berbice to Nickerie, was upset two persons drowned
- 20 Demerara Regatta; The steamship *Para* sailed for London but as detained on the bar
- 21 Mr. ASHBURY, M.P. for Brighton, arrived in his yacht *Iberia*, from Surinam
- The Right Hon. Mr. CHILDERS and family arrived by Solent
- 25 The Right Hon. Mr. CHILDERS and party sailed for Trinidad in the Royal Mail Steamer
- The Islands of Antigua, St. Christopher and Guadeloupe declared to be infected places for the purposes of the Quarantine Ordinance, 1870; Pln. *Blenhem* (Leguan) bought by the British Guiana Bank for \$19,100
- 27 Tramway extension to the Railway Station; Two Portuguese Barques arrived from Madeira with 120 passengers and immigrants
- 28 Setting in of the rainy season
- 29 Mr. James ASHBURY, M.P., sailed for Tobago, Trinidad and Barbados, in his yacht *Iberia*

December

- 3 Governor Kortright and Mrs. Kortright arrived from England
- 6 Mr. H. Stanley BURROWES died at Two Friends, in Essequebo; Mr. Charles Piercy AUSTIN, Assistant Government Secretary, appointed Received General of British Guiana
- 13 The ship *North* arrived from Calcutta with 518 coolies
- Heavy rainfall, upwards of six inches recorded in some parts of the colony
- 17 Battean accident on the river: one life lost
- The Steamship *Bel Air* arrived from Glasgow via Trinidad; Messrs. PETERS and MONTEITH, the Sugar Trade Delegates, arrived in the *Bel Air*, from Trinidad
- 26 Steamer excursion to Zeelandis, Wakenaam
- 27 Mr. William WIETINZ appointed to act as Consul for the German Empire, during the temporary absence of Mr. Arthur WEBER
- Fatal accident on the Demerara Railway
