OCTOBER 11, 1837

Page 2:5 - During a general muster in Galway on the 28th ult, Mr. Sampson WOOLSEY of Providence while engaged at the dinner table took a piece of beef into his mouth which must have taken a contrary direction and lodged in his windpipe, and in a very few minutes he was a cold and lifeless corpse. How true is the admonition "Thus in the midst of life, we are in death". He has left a large and respectable family to deplore his loss (Bal.Spa)

OCTOBER 18, 1837

Page 3:1 - In Watervliet on the 12th Inst. by Rev. Mr. MANN, Mr. George J. YEARSLEY (YEARSLEY?) of this Village to Miss Elizabeth Ann TEN EYCK formerly of Chicago.

- On Tuesday last as Edward BEAULIEU was assisting in removing a heavy piece of timber at the current St. Mary, the log fell upon him and instantly severed his head from his body.

DIED - On the 18th Inst Mrs. Mary F., wife of Mr. James BRADSHAW, Merchant of this Village in the 20th year of her age.

- At Redford, Clinton Co. on Saturday morning last, Gershom COOK Esq. age 47 years of the firm COOK, LANE, CORNING & Company of Troy.

Page 3:1 - MARRIED - In Troy Thursday evening last, by the Rev. N.S. BEMAN, William YATES Esq. to Miss Maria HICKS, both of that City.
