DIED - In this Village on Sunday morning last Mr. Ichabod BOSTWICK in the 59th year of his age .

At the Mohawk Village on the Grand River CATHARINE BRANT, relict of Capt. Joseph BRANT the celebrated leader of the six nations, age 78 years. She was the third wife of the distinquished Chief whose name during the war of the American Revolution carried terror into every border hamlet. She was morever in her own right by birth the head of the great Indian confederacy of the six nations.
