Page 2:4 - SUDDEN DEATH OF REV. PROFESSOR KNOWLES - The Rev. J.D. KNOWLES Professor of sacred rhetoric and pastoral duties in the Newton Baptist Theological Institution died yesterday afternoon 9th Inst at his residence in Newton of the varioloid. He had just returned from New York where he had been to attend the anniversary of various religious and benevolent Societies where it is supposed he contracted the disease. He has been taken away in the meridian of life from a world in which his sphere of usefulness has been great. He possessed a clear investigating mind, was an excellent classical scholar, powerful writer and a pure-minded Christian. The loss of such a man must be deeply felt not only by the particular religious denomination to which he belonged but by the whole religious community.

Page 2:5 - At Cohoes on the 14th Inst Mrs. Mercy WATSON aged 90 years. She was the widow of Capt. Titus WATSON a soldier of the Revolution and drew a pension of \$40.00 per month while living under the Act of July 4th 1836.
