Page 2:3 - SHOCKING MURDER - We have a letter from a gentleman at No. Bennington, VT dated Wednesday morning stating that on Tuesday evening the wife of Philemon BATES of that place was shot through the head by her husband's brother Archibald with a rifle. At the moment of this fiend-like murder Mrs. BATES was sitting with her infant in her arms near a stand on which was a candle, the light of which enabled the murderer to take his deadly aim. The husband of Mrs. BATES had just left the room being called out by his father who desired to inform him that Archibald had been heard that afternoon to threaten her life. The murderer fled but was pursued and overtaken. Powder and balls were found in his pocket yet he denied the commission of the crime.
