BUTLER, who enlisted at Watervliet in December 1846, after fighting gallently at Cerro Gordo, died at Jalapa on the 30th of September last. It is not known where his friends reside. Mr. TEN EYCK who knew him thinks he was from Vermont.

Page 2:5 - DIED - At Schaghticoke April 13th of consumption, Melissa wife of George W. McGREGOR, age 22 years. (The Odd Fellows of Lansingburgh, Waterford & Cohoes attended the funeral in large numbers)

- At New Woodstock, Madison County, on the 15th inst. of consumption Mr. Clement WEBBER, age 42 years (For several years Mr. WEBBER was a resident of this Village, and a pious and exemplary member of the Baptist Church. Living the life of a Christian, his end was peaceful and triumphant - communicated)

MAY 3, 1848

Page 2:5 - DIED - onthe 19th April at the house of G. CRANE, R.R. CROWNER in the 65th year of his age.

MAY 10, 1848

Page 2:5 - A WINDFALL = In pulling down an old building at the corner of Bank & State Streets in New London a few days since for the purpose of erecting a new structure, there were found stowed away under the floor of the garret, a stocking and an old cloth cap filled with Mexican and Spanish dollers. Some old miser probably did notknowwhat better to do with his money. One of those that toil for heirs, they know not who, in straight are seen no more (from the New Haven Courier)
