close of the War he received a Lieutenant's commission and was in Hamilton's Brigade at the capture of Cornwallis.

He was one of the last, if not the very last, surviving members of the Society of the Cincinnati. This is his brief, but enduring memorial. In after life General HAMILTON never visited this City without greeting, with every mark of cordiality and esteem, his companion in arms in that memorable siege which so essentially contributed toward a recognition of our national independence.

Mr. GREGORY came to this City soon after the close of the War. He was successful in business and has for many years employed an ample fortune. (from the Albany Journal).

DIED - In this Village on Wed. 24th Ult, Miss Esther ROBERTS, daughter of Hiram ROBERTS esq., age 22 years. She was lovely and beloved. Parents, sisters, brother hung over her with devoted tenderness and affection during her long sickness but death had selected her as a shining mark, for his prey. She expressed strong confidence in God, due the Redeemer, and departed in peace "Weep not, she is not dead but sleepith" Luke viii:52 - communicated
