

JULY 12, 1848

Page 2:1 - The remains of the lamented Captain VAN OLINDA, which reached Albany on the 4th inst. were on Sunday last deposited in their final resting place in the Greenbush Cemetery.

Page 2:4 - MORE DEATHS & SICKNESS FROM EATING CLAMS ARE REPORTED - Elisha SMITH of Biddeford, and all the members of his family were taken sick immediately after eating them last Saturday. Mr. SMITH died in three hours. The others were saved by violent vomiting. Turkeys and hens have been killed by the same cause. The fishermen around Kennebunkport noticed within a few days thousands of eels lying dead on the bottom of the river. Samuel WARD and family of that town were poisoned by clams but were saved by vomiting freely (from the Sun)

Page 2:5 - MARRIED - At Greenfield, NY on Saturday P.M. July 1, 1848 by Rev. Charles POMEROY, J.Q. NORRIS to Mary Jane HUBBARD, both of West Troy.

DIED - On Thursday the 29th ult in the town of Watervliet, William T. VAN OLINDA, age 27 years, brother of the late Capt. Abram VAN OLINDA who was killed in the storming of Chapultepee.

JULY 19, 1848

Page 2:5 - DIED - In this Village on the 14th inst, Mr. Andrew DRENNAN, age 46 years.

- John Hudson WILLARD in the 11th year of his age, son of John H. & Sarah L. WILLARD of Troy was drown on Friday afternoon 14th inst. bathing in the Mohawk River.

JULY 26, 1848

Page 2:5 - MARRIED - In Albany on the 19th inst at the Dolevan House by the Rev. Dr. KENNEDY, Thos. MCCREEDIE, late of Philadelphia to Miss Helen, youngest daughter of R. DUNLOP, Est. of Watervliet.

AUGUST 2, 1848

Page 2:4 - Affray occurred in South Troy on Friday night, in a person named RYAN was killed by a blow from a beer bottle, given by a man whose name we have not learned; but who has been arrested and lodged in jail (from the Troy Whig)

Page 2:5 - Mrs. WILSON, wife of a blind preacher, recently died in Wilmington, Delaware of typhoid fever, which is prevalent there. At the grave of his wife Mr. WILSON exhibited touching grief, "I have lost my eyes a second time " he said.
