Page 2:3 - MARRIED - In West Troy May 10th by the Rev. J.C. BURROUGHS, Henry S. McCALL Esq. Counselor-at-Law of Albany to Miss Rhoda W. PEASLEE, Bridgeport, Madison Co. NY

DIED - In Lansingburgh of consumption on 23d inst. Laura M. CORBIN, daughter of P.M. CORBIN Esq., Cashier of the Bank of Lansingburgh, in the 17th year of her age.

- At Amherst, Mass. 19th inst, Peter JACKSON. He was born on the passage from Africa, was a slave to a Dutchmen in Kinderhook, NY. His age as calculated by his neighbors, from his recollections of the Old French War, and as inscribed on his coffinplate presented by them was 122. He must have been over 100, in the opinion of aged inhabitants of Amherst, who have known him as an old man from their youth, favors the larger calculation.
