Page 2:3 - DEATH OF A VETERAN SAILOR - At Osterville, Mass. December 14th, Benjamin HALLETT Esq. in the 90th year of his age. He was known and honored as the pioneer of the Coasting Trade between Boston and the Hudson River. He commanded the first vessel that sailed between Boston and Albany and Troy and in 1778 executed a contract with Mr. BULFINCH for transporting four loads of marble from Kinderhook for building the State House at Boston. Two or three sloops were sufficient at that time for a trade which now loads fleets and railroads. He was universally known among the Coasting trade as the Captain of the TEN SISTERS which he built at Catskill in 1805, the most famous Packet of her time. (from the Albany Express)
