Page 2:5 - MARRIED - In this Village June 12th by Rev. J.C. BURROUGHS, Mr. John W. SHARP to Miss Anna BORTLE, both of West Troy.

By the same June 16th, Mr. John HALL of Troy to Miss Mary Ann HALL of West Troy.

JULY 3, 1850

Page 2:3 - DIED - In this Village on Sunday morning June 30th, at the residence of her brother, Mr. G.B. SMITH, Miss Caroline Amelia SMITH in the 23d year of her age. She bore her sickness with Christian fortitude and resignation and it may indeed be truly said that with her "Life so sweetly ceased to be - It lapsed in immortality"

JULY 17, 1850

Page 2:3 - A long obit on the death of Zachery TAYLOR, President of the U.S.

3:1 - MARRIED - In Saratoga on the 4th inst. by the Rev. P. WEAVER, Wm. P. GERMAN of Watervliet to Miss Maria WEAVER of the same place.

In Troy on the 4th inst. by Rev. G.C. BALDWIN, Mr. David GRISWALD to Mary E. FOLMSBEE, both of West Troy.

JULY 24, 1850

Page 2:5 - The venerable relict of Judge Simion BALDWIN died in New Haven, Tuesday at the advanced age of 85. She was the last surviving child of the Hon. Roger SHERMAN, one of Connecticut's Representatives in the signing of the Declaration of Independence.

JULY 31, 1850

Page 2:2 - INQUEST - Coroner LANDON held an inquest on the 20th inst at the Junction of the Erie & Champlain Canal on the body of James MCFARLAND. He was engaged in tending Lock No. 3 at that place. It appears he went on the lock about 12 o'clock on the night of the 18th and the night being dark and stormy and he partially intoxicated, it is supposed fell in accidentally. There were no marks of violence on his person. It is said he had friends residing in New Scotland, Albany County and also at Fort Edward on the Champlain Canal.
