Page 2:3 - A young man named LEE committed suicide at Waterford last Wednesday morning at the Public House of Daniel MULLIGAN by cutting his throat with a penknife. While in the act, he was discovered by a young boy, but before proper assistance could be called, he had accomplished his purpose. He was from Boston and was a mechanic. He was in an entire state of destitution which may probably account for the rash act.

Page 2:5 - DIED - In Watervliet on the 15th inst. Mrs. Elenor MURPHY, relict of the late Philip MURPHY, in the 73d year of her age.

### AUGUST 28, 1850

Page 2:3 - An article on murder by Mrs. Hannah SECORD, wife of John SECORD, a wealthy farmer, living about two miles from Fishkill Village on road to Johnsville. She cut the throat of a girl named Mary Ann SMITH, age between 15 & 16 who was a domestic in SECORD home.

Page 2:5 - DEATH OF AN EDITOR - James M. STEVENSON, Esq. Proprietor & Editor of the Troy Daily Whig died on Wednesday, August 21st of typhoid fever at Cambridge, Washington Co. in the 42d year of his age. Mr. STEVENSON was a man of many virtues - and a single infirmity. He had numerous friends and no enemies; and now that he has gone memory goes back to the days his talents, his generous & gentle nature, his attractive manners, and agreeable conversation, gave promise of usefulness, of prosperity and happiness. ex
