Page 3:1 - DIED - At 12 o'clock on Sunday last of dropsey on the brain, Elizabeth, daughter of Francis & Angelica HARDING, age 13 months.

Page 2:5 - MARRIED - In Cohoes on the 13th inst. by Rev. L. POTTER, Charles H. PARIS to Miss Amy L. HART, all of West Troy.

AUGUST 27, 1851

Page 2:3 - MAN KILLED BY ACCIDENT - A melancholy occurrence took place yesterday afternoon at the corner of Spencer & Montgomery Streets over the grocery of William CARROLL. From the evidence taken before John O. COLE at the station house in Center Street we learn the following facts, It seems that a woman living in the 2d story was engaged sawing wood when Margaret HANER, residing below, went upstairs and remonstrated with the woman for making so much noise - when a quarrel ensued, and Mrs. HANER seized a stick of wood and threw it out of the window: It struck a man named John RYAN, who was passing, on the temple and he died from the effects of the blow at 9 o'clock last night. The woman was arrested and is now in custody. RYAN leaves a wife and five children who reside in Canada. (from the Albany Knick. 26th inst.)

Page 2:5 - RARE MARRIAGE - In Concord, KY Joseph MORE, 78 years of age and a veteran of the last War with England, was married to Mrs. Mary TOLEN, age 74 years. The Magistrate who officiated on the occasion was 72 years old. This union makes . . . the 3d wife to the groom and the 5th husband to the bride - Mr. MORE has obtained a land warrant under the Act of Congress of 1850 and intends to settle on it in order to raise his family.

Page 2:4 - DEATH OF DR. FITCH - The report of Doct. FITCH's death is confirmed. He expired at the hospital of the Sisters of Charity in Detroit on Monday last, age 43. He was a physician and a man of property. He was a principal or leader of the men who are on trial for burning the Railroad Depot at Detroit.
