DIED - In Troy on Wednesday evening 3d inst., William Henry, son of Edwin L. & Mary STODDARD, age 22 months, 4 days.

Page 2:5 - MARRIED - In West Troy on March 15, 1852 by the Rev. J.C. BURROUGHS, Mr. Joseph TAYLOR to Miss Harriet VANZANT, both of Albany.
