An accident on the Boston & Maine R.R. resulting in the death of ......."The funeral services on the son of Gen. Franklin PIERCE took place this morning at the house of Mr. AIKEN in Andover. Rev. Mr. PARKER of Concord in whose Church Mr. PIERCE & his wife are regular attendants officiated. The services consisted of an address, prayer & singing. At 1-1/2 o'clock the remains were conveyed to Concord in a special train for burial. Gen. PIERCE rode in the first coach. Mrs. P. did not come on with the remains of her child. She will remain at Andover with her sister Mrs. AIKEN until her health is sufficiently restored to such a degree of quietness and resignation as to inspire the most encouraging hopes in her friends.
