Page 2:3 - On Friday last one of our Coroners: was called to view the body of Jacob SNYDER jr who was found dead in the house of Jacob HOLSAPPLE in the town of Ghent. The deceased was found dead about 8 o'clock in the morning standing nearly upright, his breasts and arms resting upon a stageing erected in the room (which had been used as a ballroom) and grasping in hishands a bottle of whiskey!! --in this position he was suffered to stand until the arrival of the coroner when he was laid down flat upon the floor, still grasping the fatal bottle, which was with difficulty taken out of his hands. -Verdict-death by intemperance (from the Hudson R.I.P.)

Page 3:1 - MARRIED - In Albany on the 7th Inst by Rev. Truman SEYMOUR Mr. James M. EDGERTON of this Village to Miss Mary MARTIN of the former place.

JANUARY 22, 1840

Page 3:1 - DIED - At Utica on the 3d Inst, after a short illness of hemorrhage, Miss Lucretia Cynthia SHEPARD, in the 21st year of her age, formerly of Watervliet, Albany County and late assistant in the female Seminary of Natchez, Miss. At the time of the deathof Miss S. she was on a visit to her relatives in this State and was to have been married in a few days.

JANUARY 29, 1840

Page 3:2 - MARRIED - In So. Shaftsbury, Vermont on the 19th Inst, by the Rev. William BELL, Col. Dwight CORKINS to Miss Lydia BOYNTON, daughter of General BONYNTON.
