Page 2:3 - SUN STRUCK - A man by the name of DUNNE was prostrated by the effects of the sun about 2 o'clock on Sat. afternoon while in the employ of the Albany Northern Railroad Company near Waterford. He wandered a short distance off in the shade of the woods, and about 6 o'clock he was found dead. His flesh appeared quite black and swollen. He was interred the same evening. (from the Albany Knickerbocker)

Page 2:5 - MARRIED - In Cohoes on the 9th inst. by the Rev. C.N. WALDRON, Mr. Robert W. FRISBY of West Troy and Margaret, daughter of John VANDEMARK.

Page 2:5 - MARRIED - In this Village on the 20th inst. by Daniel C. STEWART Esq., Mr. John SCOFIELD of Greenfield, Saratoga Co. to Miss Eliza Ann PETERS of West Troy.

DIED - In Boston, August 12th of dysentery, Mr. Samuel CONGER, formerly of this place, aged 36 years.

- In this Village August 17th of consumption, Harriet Ann ALSTON, eldest daughter of David & Nancy A. ALSTON, aged 20 years. (POEM)

Page 2:3 - Mrs. ROBINSON the alleged murderess, now confined in Rensselaer Co. Jail, says the Troy Times appears to be in good spirits, and is not in so much of a hurry to have her existence terminated as she manifested some weeks ago. She is quite cheerful and declares herself prepared for any fate.

Page 2:1 - SUPPOSED MURDER - The quiet of our Village has been again disturbed and as public journalists we are compelled to chronicle the horrible affair; A wife supposed to have been murdered by her husband, while both were under the effects of alcoholic poison. The Coroner upon repairing to the scene of the murder at their residence in Burlington St., in the upper part of this Village, found the woman lying dead upon the floor near the fireplace. Her head was badly bruised in front as if it been struck by some blunt instrument, a triangular cut through the scalp upon the back of her head, her left arm badly burnt and other marks of violence were found about her person.
