Page 2:1 - SAD ACCIDENT - On Thursday afternoon last, Carrie DELAWARE, a girl about 5-1/2 years of age in company with her sister, was looking at the operations of the machinery connected with one of the saws in Coffin's Mill, on Broad St. near the Upper Ferry, when she became dizzy and fell through the trap door, into the saw-pit and was struck by the pitman, connected to the balance wheel. The machinery was quickly stopped, and some of the hands repaired to the place of the accident, when she was found lying near the pit, her head hanging over, where she was probably thrown by the pitman while making its revolution.
